## *Re:* FINAL AGENCY DECISION

APPROVAL OF APPLICATION TO AMEND ALTERNATIVE TREATMENT CENTER ("ATC") PERMIT ALLOWING CHANGE OF NAME

Dear Michael McQueeny, Esquire:

The New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission ("NJ-CRC") has received and reviewed your application requesting a name change from Community Wellness Center of NJ LLC to RIPT Dispensary, LLC. Upon the completion of the NJ-CRC's review, your application has been approved.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30A-7.8(a)(3), an ATC shall submit to the NJ-CRC an application for an amended permit prior to any change of the alternative treatment center's name. Additionally, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30A-7.1(b)(2), each applicant for an ATC permit, shall submit documentation of a valid Business Registration Certificate on file with the New Jersey Department of the Treasury, Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services.

After review of your application, the NJ-CRC determined that your entity has adequately filed an amendment with the New Jersey Department of Treasury, Division of Revenue and Enterprise Services with the new business name. Further, the NJ-CRC determined that the new name will not have a detrimental effect on the patient population. Having met the applicable requirements, your application to change your business's name to RIPT Dispensary, LLC is approved.
