APPROVAL OF APPLICATION ALLOWING MODIFICATION OF CAPACITY, PHYSICAL PLANT, PREMISES, OR ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE FOR ADULT USE LICENSE AND MEDICAL CANNABIS PERMIT

The New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission ("NJ-CRC" or "Commission") has received and reviewed GTI NJ Hackettstown LLC's application requesting approval of a modification of capacity, physical plant, premises, or administrative office. Specifically, GTI NJ Hackettstown LLC, an expanded Alternative Treatment Center ("expanded ATC"), has requested approval to add four flower rooms and one vegetative room to its licensed premise, thereby increasing its canopy size from 15,970 square feet (Tier II) to 25,186 square feet (Tier III). Your application has been approved, pending payment of the requisite fee of **\$4,000** and subject to passing a final onsite assessment.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-9.2(a)(5), a cannabis business shall submit to the NJ-CRC an application for an amended license prior to any modification of a cannabis business's capacity, physical plant, premises, or administrative office. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-7.17(j), the fee to apply for a change or modification of a cannabis business's capacity or physical plant is \$2,000. Similarly, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30A-7.8, an ATC shall submit to the NJ-CRC an application for an amended permit prior to any modification of an ATC's capacity or physical plant. Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30A-7.10, the fee to apply for a change in the ATC's capacity or any physical modification or addition to the facility is \$2,000.
