Andrew Becker, MSW, LCSW, ACSW, MAC, LCADC, SAC	I agree with Kevin Sabet, Ph.D. and Robert S. Weiner and ask that the Commission require health warning labels on Marijuana and THC Drug Products. Every marijuana derived-or THC-containing product should have two components. The potency of Delta- 9 THC- the cannabinoid in marijuana that produces a high, and then a primer on the negative impacts of marijuana: psychosis, impaired driving, addiction, suicidality, uncontrolled vomiting(cannabis hyperemesis syndrome). Warning labels should also alert potential harm to fetuses/not to be used by pregnant women, should explicitly say this is not to be used by breastfeeding women, can be harmful to pets, and include a disclaimer that marijuana is not approved by the FDA to treat or cure any disease or condition.
