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	The higher the THC potency, the greater the risk of negative health impacts and addiction, especially for young people. More frequent use compounds these consequences. Any product that contains more than 10% THC should be labeled as "High Potency" and warrants its own disclosures about the risks of using high-potency THC, this will help customers make the connection. All marijuana outlets-medical or retail-should be required to display posters visible to all patrons with these health warnings.
