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To the Editor:

It is always fascinating that (new) discoveries are so often antedated by folk medicine. The article by Tashkin, Shapiro and Frank¹ on the pulmonary effects of marihuana recalls Henry Hyde Salter's² treatise on asthma, in which he states: "The Indian hemp, *Cannabis sativa*, is much given in India as an anti-asthmatic, and among the natives has a great reputation. I can easily imagine from its physiological action that its reputation is well deserved."

In short, a hundred years ago the effect of cannabis on pulmonary physiology that was so nicely documented with modern instruments was known on an empirical basis by the natives of India.
