MINUTES - PUBLIC MEETING NO. 26-02-11
February 11, 2026 - 10:30 p.m.

New Jersey Casino Control Commission

In furtherance of Governor Philip D. Murphy's Executive Order 103 (2020), the Casino Control Commission's meeting was held via remote technology, as well as in person. The public listened telephonically by calling the telephone number and access number provided on the Commission's website, and public comments were accepted via e-mail.

Subsequent to the reading of a statement of compliance with the notice requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, the Commission considered and took formal action on the following matters:

1. By a vote of 3-0, ratified the minutes of January 14 2026 (transcript pages 9-10).
2. By a vote of 3-0, Joyce Mollineaux was elected Vice Chairman of the Commission until the Reorganization Meeting in January 2027 (ruling number 26-02-11-02; transcript pages 10-13).

- 3 By a vote of 3-0, granted the initial applications of Ana L. Contreras-Oraco and Jarrod B. Schwarz, for casino key employee licenses (transcript pages 13-15).

By a vote of 3-0, remanded the initial application of Jodi L. Hendrie (*a/k/a* Jodi L. Eichler), for a casino key employee license to a hearing (Exhibit EL-2*; transcript page 15-16); and

By a vote of 3-0, remanded the initial application of Michael R. Reynolds, for a casino key employee license to a hearing (Exhibit EL-2*; transcript page 15-16).

4. By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmitted applications of Brian S. Barnett, Naja J. Coursey (*a/k/a* Naja J. Bigelow), Christine Fabel (*a/k/a* Christine Dwyer), Marshon X. Glass, Alexis A. Gonzalez, John E. Happersett, Joseph A. Melchionne, Jr., Hong D. Pham, Nathaniel T. Ross, Sr., Geoffrey G. Salinas, Corina Silva (*a/k/a* Corina Chirinos, Corina Hernandez), William H. Wentz, 3rd, Kathaleen L. Wilkins, for casino key employee licenses. (Exhibit EL-1*; transcript pages 16-19);

By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmission application of Christine M. Pacifico (*a/k/a* Christine M. Ross), for casino key employee license, with a multi-casino endorsement, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-91.1 (transcript page 19-20);

By a vote of 3-0, remanded the resubmitted application of Rebecca L. Butler-Nesbitt (*a/k/a* Rebecca L. Butler, Rebecca L. Nesbitt), for a casino key employee license to a hearing (Exhibit EL-2*; transcript page 20-22);

By a vote of 3-0, remanded the resubmitted application of Rakeem D. Stewart, for a casino key employee license to a hearing (Exhibit EL-2*; transcript page 20-22);

By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmitted casino key employee license application of Vincent A. Alfieri, Sr. and for qualification as Vice President of Table Games for AC Ocean Walk, LLC (*d/b/a* Ocean Casino Resorts) (Exhibit EL-3*; transcript pages 22-23);

By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmitted casino key employee license application of William M. Fritz (*a/k/a* Bill M. Fritz); and for qualification as Director of Food and Beverage for Boardwalk Regency Corporation, LLC (*d/b/a* Caesars Atlantic City) (Exhibit EL-3*; transcript pages 23-24);

By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmitted casino key employee license application of Patrick D. Martin and for qualification as Vice President Regional Compliance for MGM Resorts International; and waived the residency requirement, as provided for in N.J.S.A. 5:12-89(b) (Exhibit EL-3*; transcript pages 24-26);

By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmitted casino key employee license application of Edmund L. Quatmann, Jr.; and for qualification as Executive Vice President and Chief Legal Officer for Caesars Entertainment, Inc.; and waived the residency requirement, as provided for in N.J.S.A. 5:12-89(b) (Exhibit EL-3*; transcript pages 26-28); and

By a vote of 3-0, granted the resubmitted casino key employee license application of Edward A. Taylor; and for qualification as Vice President of Casino Marketing for Harrah's Atlantic City Operating Company, LLC (*d/b/a* Harrah's Resorts Atlantic City) (Exhibit EL-3*; transcript page 28-29).

5. Temporary casino key employee licenses were issued between January 1, 2026 and January 31, 2026, pursuant to Delegation of Authority Resolution Number 22-01-12-11-B to the following applicants: Sabrina R. Cottman, Amada L. Jagdeo (*a/k/a* Latchmie Jagdeo), Amir H. Mahmoud, Danh P. Nguyen, Maria L. Piechowski (*a/k/a* Maria L. Alberts, Maria L. Samolowicz) and Chris D. Rodriguez (Exhibit EL-3*; transcript pages 29-31).
6. By a vote of 3-0, granted the requested relief and inactivated the casino key employee licenses held by Rosemarie A. Cook (*a/k/a* Rosemarie A. Lynn, Rosemarie A. Moschella), Andrew J. Dichiaro, Lynette A. Holcomb, Francis A. Iannello, Barry J. Lubin, Karin J. Quay (*a/k/a* Karin J. Klein, Karin J. Klein-Wirkki) and James Weatherford (Ruling numbers 26-02-11-06-A, 26-02-11-06-B, 26-02-11-06-C, 26-02-11-06-D, 26-02-11-06-E, 26-02-11-06-F, 26-02-11-06-G; transcript pages 31-33).
7. By a vote of 3-0, found that Bhupendra G. Dave, Steven T. Laning, Marjorie L. Tomasic (*a/k/a* Marjorie L. Duncan) and Louis J. Totoro, casino key employee licenses lapsed, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:41A-6.1 (f) of the regulations. (Ruling numbers 26-02-11-07-A, 26-02-11-07-B, 26-02-11-07-C, 26-02-11-07-D; transcript pages 33-35).
8. Considered the initial application of Ryan Peters, for a casino key employee license and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, approved the stipulation of settlement between the Division of Gaming Enforcement and Applicant; and granted the initial application of Ryan Peters, for a casino key employee license, subject to compliance with the terms and conditions as provided for in the stipulation (DKT 25-0200-CK) (Ruling number 26-02-11-08; transcript pages 35-37).
9. Considered the initial application of Dazhaona A. Moses, for a casino key employee license and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, approved the stipulation of settlement between the Division of Gaming Enforcement and Applicant; and granted the initial application of Dazhaona A. Moses, for a casino key employee license, subject to compliance with the terms and conditions as provided for in the stipulation (DKT 25-0163-CK) (Ruling number 26-02-11-09; transcript pages 37-40).

10. Considered the initial application of Courtney Boone, for a casino key employee license and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, found Courtney Boone ("Applicant"), disqualified, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-80 (b), N.J.S.A. 5:12-80 (d), N.J.S.A. 5:12-86 and N.J.S.A. 5:12-89; and denied Applicant's initial application for a casino key employee license (DKT 25-0192-CK) (Ruling number 26-02-11-10; transcript pages 40-43).

11. Considered the Initial Decision in the matter of the Appeal of J.M. for Removal from the Self Exclusion List and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, modified the Initial Decision of Hearing Examiner, Mario C. Formica, Commissioner, to reflect that the date on page two should be January 8, 2025, not August 14, 2024; and

- a) adopted Initial Decision as modified, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:1-18.6;
- b) found that Appellant failed to demonstrate that he did not intentionally place himself on the self-exclusion list, as required by N.J.A.C. 13:69G-2.2 (c); and
- c) denied his request to be removed from the self-exclusion list, prior to his January 8, 2026 expiration date

(25-0152-AP) (Initial Decision) (Ruling number 26-02-11-11; transcript pages 43-55).

12. Considered the Division of Gaming Enforcement motion and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, granted the requested relief and Ordered that the initial application of Kyledia Macon for a casino key employee license, be transferred back to the Division of Gaming Enforcement, in order to fully complete its investigation (DKT-23-0048-RC; DKT-23-0056-CK) (DKT-26-0011-OT) (Ruling number 26-02-11-12; transcript pages 55-59).

13. By a vote of 3-0, adopted the Initial Decision of Hearing Examiner, Mario C. Formica, Commissioner, and issued a plenary casino key employee license to Travis Thanh Truong; and found Mr. Truong qualified to serve as Vice President Asian Marketing for Marina District Development Company, LLC (*d/b/a* Borgata Hotel casino & Spa) (DKT 25-0198-CK) (Ruling Number 26-02-11-13; transcript pages 59-66).

14. By a vote of 3-0, adopted the draft resolution and found Albert L. Forkner, plenary qualified to serve as a Director of Pioneer Fiduciary Company, LLC., in accordance with N.J.S.A. 5:12-85.1 and N.J.A.C. 13:69C-2.7 (Ruling Number 26-02-11-14; transcript pages 66-71).

15. Considered the joint petition of Marina District Development Company, LLC (*d/b/a* Borgata Hotel casino & Spa) and MGM Resorts International, and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, adopted the draft resolution and authorized Karen M. Wells, on a temporary basis and prior to plenary qualification, to assume the duties and exercise the powers of a Member of the Compliance Committee for MGM Resorts International, pending plenary qualification, subject to the conditions contained in N.J.S.A. 5:12-85.1c and N.J.A.C. 13:69C-2.7 (PRN 0272601) (Ruling number 26-02-11-15; transcript pages 71-74).

16. Considered the following Delegated Authorities, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 19:40A-2.5(a):

By votes of 3-0, adopted as amended the Commissions' Resolutions delegating authority to perform certain functions to the Chairman and Director of Regulatory Affairs, and readopted the Commissions' Resolutions delegating authority to perform certain functions to the General Counsel and Executive Secretary of the Casino Control Commission, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:40-2.5(a) (26-02-11-16-A, 26-02-11-16-B, 26-02-11-16-C, 02-11-16-D; transcript pages 78-84).

17. Considered the joint petition of DGMB Casino, LLC (*d/b/a* Resorts Atlantic City) and MGA Holding NJ, LLC, and issued the following ruling:

By a vote of 3-0, adopted the draft resolution and authorized Joseph Hasson, on a temporary basis and prior to plenary qualification, to assume the duties and exercise the powers of Manager and President for MGA Holding NJ, LLC, pending plenary qualification, subject to the conditions contained in N.J.S.A. 5:12-85.1c and N.J.A.C. 13:69C-2.7 (PRN 0122601) (Ruling number 26-02-11-17; transcript pages 74-78).

In accordance with Resolution No. 25-12-10-03, the next closed session of the Commission shall be held on Wednesday, March 11, 2026 at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission Offices (transcript page 84).

There being no members of the public to address the Commission, the meeting adjourned at 11:43 a.m.
