**WHEREAS**, the Commission considered the entire record of the proceedings at its public meeting of May 17, 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Commission that Lisa Rankin be issued a temporary casino key employee license with a waiver of the residency requirement pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 5:12-89b(4) and -89e and *N.J.A.C.* 19:41A-5.3 pending plenary licensure; and





**WHEREAS**, casino licensee Caesars Interactive Entertainment New Jersey, LLC (“CIENJ”) and its qualified parent holding company, Caesars Entertainment, Inc. (“CEI”) having filed a Joint Petition (PRN 0752304) dated March 14, 2023 seeking a ruling from the New Jersey Casino Control Commission (“Commission”) pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 5:12-1 et seq.* (“the Act”) finding William Hill US Holdco, Inc. (“WH US”) qualified as a new holding company of casino licensee, CIENJ, and finding that the natural person qualifiers of WH US remain qualified or are qualified; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 20, 2013 the Commission granted casino licensure to CIENJ as an Internet gaming affiliate pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 5:12-82b(5)* (Commission Resolution No. 13-11-20-15); and

**WHEREAS**, on July 15, 2020, the Commission approved the Merger Agreement between Eldorado Resorts Inc. and CEI and determined that the merged entity, CEI, its qualifying entities, and its natural person qualifiers,

including, among others, Anthony Carano, Edmund Quatmann, Thomas Reeg and Bret Yunker continued to meet the requirements for licensure as set forth in *N.J.S.A. 5:12-84* and *-85* (Commission Order No. 20-07-15-14); and

**WHEREAS**, on or about September 30, 2020 CEI entered into an agreement for the acquisition of William Hill PLC, pursuant to which WH US would become an intermediary holding company of CIENJ; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Division of Gaming Enforcement (“Division”) Director Order No. 2146 dated March 16, 2021, CEI was named the sole and exclusive manager of CIENJ pending qualification of WH US as a holding company of CIENJ; and

**WHEREAS**, on or about April 22, 2021, CEI acquired WH US, thereafter merging Caesars Interactive Entertainment (“CIE”), a qualified holding company of CIENJ, into WH US, with CIENJ thereafter becoming a wholly-owned subsidiary of WH US; and

**WHEREAS**, CEI collectively refers to its online and sports wagering operations through WH US and its subsidiaries as “Caesars Digital”; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 6, 2022, pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 5:12-87.1*, the Division reviewed the casino license of CIENJ, and determined that its entity qualifiers and natural person qualifiers continued to meet the requirements for licensure as set forth in *N.J.S.A. 5:12-84* and *-85*; and

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**WHEREAS**, by Order No. 2456 dated September 27, 2022, the Division Director granted the application of William Hill New Jersey, Inc. ("WHNJ) for casino service industry enterprise licensure pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 5:12-92a(1)* and determined that its qualifying entities, WH US, American Wagering, Inc. ("AWI") and CEI, as well as individual qualifiers designated therein, met the criteria for qualification pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 5:12-92b*; and

**WHEREAS**, the Division designated the following officers as natural person qualifiers of WH US pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 5:12-85.1*: Shawn Bailey as Senior Vice President ("SVP") and Chief Financial Officer ("CFO") of Caesars Digital; Anthony Carano as Director, President and Chief Operating Officer ("COO") of WH US; Kenneth Fuchs as SVP and COO of Caesars Digital; David Grolman as SVP and Chief Retail Sportsbook Officer of WH US; Eric Hession as President, Caesars Digital; Martin Logan as Chief Technology Officer and Chief Product Officer of WH US; Edmund Quatmann as Executive VP, Chief Legal Officer and Secretary of WH US; Thomas Reeg as Director and Chief Executive Officer ("CEO") of WH US; Ty Stewart as SVP World Series of Poker® of WH US; Trent Striplin, VP Payments & Fraud of WH US; Matthew Sunderland, SVP iGaming of WH US, and Bret Yunker, CFO of WH US; and



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**WHEREAS**, Anthony Carano, Edmund Quatmann, Thomas Reeg, and Bret Yunker having been previously found qualified by the Commission in connection with the casino licensure of CEI, remain qualified; and

**WHEREAS**, Ty Stewart having been previously granted a casino key employee license, with residency waiver, and qualification by the Commission to serve in a prior position for CIE and CIENJ, remains qualified (Commission Resolution No. 20-08-12-14); and

**WHEREAS**, Shawn Bailey, Trent Striplin and Matthew Sunderland having been issued temporary casino key employee licenses, with residency waivers as to Shawn Bailey and Trent Striplin, and granted temporary qualification by the Commission to serve in their respective positions (Commission Resolution Nos. 22-11-09-13, 22-11-09-12 and 22-11-09-11, respectively); and

**WHEREAS**, the Division filed a letter report dated April 3, 2023 and four (4) individual qualifier reports dated April 3, 2023 wherein it recommended that the Commission grant the relief requested; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission considered the entire record in this matter, together with the presentations of counsel, at its public meeting of May 17, 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Commission that based upon the reports of the Division and all other evidence presented to the Commission at the public meeting of May 17, 2023, Petitioners' request to qualify



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WH US, and its natural person qualifiers is hereby **GRANTED** based upon the findings and rulings specified herein.

**FINDINGS and RULINGS**

Based upon consideration of the entire record of these proceedings, the Commission enters the following findings and rulings:

1. WH US and its natural person qualifiers hereto have complied with all requirements regarding the submission of information necessary to the Commission and the Division to evaluate PRN 0752304;
2. The persons whose qualification needs to be established for purposes of PRN 0752304 are: Shawn Bailey, Anthony Carano, Kenneth Fuchs, David Grolman, Eric Hession, Martin Logan, Edmund Quatmann, Thomas Reeg, Ty Stewart, Trent Striplin, Matthew Sunderland and Bret Yunker, each of whom has been either previously found qualified by the Commission and remain qualified pursuant to applicable provisions of the Act or has been found temporarily qualified by the Commission or with respect to Mssrs. Fuchs, Grolman, Hession and Logan are hereby found qualified;
3. WH US has established compliance with *N.J.S.A. 5:12-82d(7),(8) and (10) and 85b*;




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

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
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
**WHEREAS**, her passion, professionalism, tenacity and wisdom earned her the praise, respect and admiration of her colleagues and the entire casino gaming community;


