So what happened was, I hit it once or twice. But I said to the slot people, I said, sir, I just filled up the screen. What happened? I didn't get anything. So he went to open up the machine, you know, and he showed me everything filled up except one coin. I said, that's not what I had.

So in the meantime, another slot attendant came and a supervisor came over. So I said to him -- and the woman is running over to me, talking about Miss, Miss, I just told my girlfriend. You won \$11,000. I said, you saw it? She said, yeah. So I said, okay. So I said, run the machine back. So the guy says,

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- there's a dispute. Not the machine. You're to
- 3 run the cameras back if there is a dispute. So
- 4 my first due process was violated there. So then
- 5 I came back to the casino. First I tried to call
- 6 Milton. He's the director. I don't know his
- 7 last name. On the slot part. I get back there.
- 8 They wouldn't let me talk to him. I get back

- there. I asked one of the supervisors, where's 10

Milton? They said, he's walking around.

So I saw Milton. So he goes over to the machine, goes over to, and the other guy come over from security. They gave me the form to send to you to guys, the DGE.
