Overview:

FEMA funding for crisis counseling is available to the Department of Human Services through two programs: (1) the Immediate Services Program (ISP) which provides funds for up to 60 days of services immediately following a disaster declaration; and (2) the Regular Services Program (RSP) which provides funds for up to nine months following a disaster declaration.

Federal Requirements / Restrictions:

The final accounting of funds and SF425, Federal Financial Report, for this program must be submitted to the FEMA Region II Administrator with documentation of expenditures within 90 days of the end of the Immediate Services Program.

Selection Standards:

The Department of Human Services will be provided federal funds transferred to them from the Division of State Police (Department of Law and Public Safety) to implement the NJ Hope and Healing Crisis Counseling Program which offers counseling to those impacted by Hurricane Sandy.

Eligibility Standards:

An application for Federal Assistance, SF 424, and certification of expenditures must be submitted and approved by FEMA to grant this funding. Department of Human Services did apply and receive funding based upon their application.
