#### Overview:

The Department Children and Families (DCF) has posted a Request for Qualifications for providers that can provide summer camp respite services to families who have children identified with behavioral health challenges. The project will be proceed with funding from the Sandy Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) to handle the increased needs of these families in Sandy affected counties. Sandy Camp Respite services for caregivers of youth and young adults with behavioral assistance needs are essential services in allowing caregivers to care for their family member at home. When a disaster happens and family daily routines are significantly altered, the stress can be daunting. Respite services are even more essential in times of crisis. DCF proposes to make respite services more readily available to caregivers of children/youth and young adults with special needs to ease the stress for families. These respite services will allow for caregivers to find the space necessary to address the disaster related needs of the family. Youth with behavioral health challenges will be able to participate in summer camp which will give their caregivers an opportunity to participate in recovery activities while their youth participates in supervised and structured activities. The program will provide access to camp to approximately 525 children/youth over the course of 2 years in impacted counties.

Eligibility Standards:
All children residing in eligible counties shall be eligible if referred by our central intake system
at PerformCare. Each family shall be required to sign an attestation.
