Services will be provided to essential partners, identified via an RFP to Regional Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention (CLPP) Coalitions, local health departments, and county health departments within New Jersey's nine most Sandyimpacted counties (Atlantic, Bergen, Cape May, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean, and Union).

Targeted assistance will be directed to the 9 most heavily impacted counties in New Jersey (Atlantic, Bergen, Cape May, Essex, Hudson, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean, and Union).
