YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NJ

WHO CAN REGISTER TO VOTE IN NJ?

You can register to vote if you are not currently serving a sentence of incarceration (indictable offense), are a US Citizen, are at least 17 years old (you may not vote until you are 18), and a resident of the county for 30 days before the election

BUT I WAS CHARGED/INCARCERATED. CAN I REGISTER? YES!

- If you have been charged but not yet sentenced, YOU CAN register to vote.
- If you are being released from prison, YOU CAN register to vote.
- If you were incarcerated but are not currently, YOU CAN register to vote.
- If you are on parole or probation, YOU CAN register to vote.
- If you are out on bail & pending appeal, YOU CAN register to vote.

HOW DO I REGISTER TO VOTE?

To register, YOU NEED to provide:

- · Your date of birth AND
- A current / unexpired <u>Driver's License</u> or a non-driver <u>Identification Card</u> (ID card) issued by the NJ Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC)

 OR
- The last 4 digits of your Social Security Number

WHAT ELSE CAN I DO?

- YOU CAN VOTE.
- YOU CAN apply for a Vote-By-Mail ballot.
- YOU CAN choose to declare a political party.

WHAT ELSE DO I HAVE TO KNOW?

- YOU CAN legally get help when filling out the voter registration form. The person helping you MUST provide their name and address on the bottom of the form.
- IF YOU MOVE to a new address, YOU MUST update your voter registration information.
