
## THE NEWARK PRISONER REENTRY INITIATIVE

The Newark Prisoner Reentry Initiative (NPRI) can provide you with the services you need to return home, including:


- > Case Management
- > Mentoring
- > Job Readiness Skills
- > Job Placement

To participate, you must:

- > Be a Newark resident
- Have been convicted as an adult and imprisoned
- Have been released from prison, jail or halfway house in the past 180 days. Depending on your halfway house rules, you may also be able to participate if you live in a halfway house



The Newark Prisoner Reentry Initiative is funded with a \$2,000,000 grant from the US Department of Labor. This grant covers fifty percent of the cost of the NPRI. The City is grateful for additional matching funds provided by the Nicholson Foundation and other private sources. The Newark Prisoner Reentry Initiative is an equal opportunity program. Auxiliary aids and services are available upon request to individuals with disabilities.
