FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

In the Matter of Melissa Grobelny, Advocate Victim Witness Program (C0048S), Burlington County

Examination Appeal

Melissa Grobelny appeals the determination of the Division of Selection Services (Selection Services) that she did not meet the experience requirements for the open competitive examination for Advocate Victim Witness Program (C0048S), Burlington County.

The examination at issue was announced with specific requirements that had to be met as of the January 27, 2014 closing date (see attached). A total of 72 individuals applied for the subject examination that resulted in a list of 18 eligibles with an expiration date of June 18, 2017. Certification OL141043 was issued containing the names of 19 eligibles and with a disposition due date of November 11, 2014.

On Ms. Grobelny's application, she indicated that she worked provisionally in the title under test from October 2013 to the January 27, 2014 closing date, as a Clerk Transcriber from March 2012 to October 2013, as a Legal Assistant/Team Leader from June 2010 to March 2012, as a Part-Time Line/Cashier for Moe's Southwest Grill from December 2009 to May 2010, and as an Intern for Edison Wetlands Association from October 2009 to December 2009. She also possesses a Bachelor's degree. Selection Services credited Ms. Grobelny for having met the education requirement and having four months of experience based on her provisional experience in the subject test, but determined that her other experience was not applicable. It commented that her primary duties in her other experience were not in providing advice and referral services to individuals or groups coping

Legal Assistant/Team Leader for a law firm, Ms. Grobelny clarifies that her primary focus in this position was to advise clients on the legal process concerning applying for and receiving social security disability benefits and referring them to other resources that could also assist with their issues. In other words, her primary responsibility was to act as a client advocate for clients who had mental, physical, emotional, financial, and other problems. Additionally, while it may have not have been the primary focus, the Commission also notes that her experience as a Clerk Transcriber for the Prosecutor's Office has provided her with a background in communicating with individuals, understanding the criminal justice system, and familiarity with software/computer systems and departmental practices that have enabled her to perform the duties of the title under test with minimal training. Accordingly, based on the clarification provided in the instant matter, Ms. Grobelny has demonstrated that she met the experience requirement for the title under test and should be admitted to the examination.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this appeal be granted, the appellant's application be processed, and if she achieves a high enough score, her name be added to the outstanding certification for current employment opportunities.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
