Examination Appeal

Julio Vega appeals the determination of the Division of Agency Services (Agency Services) that he did not meet the experience requirement for the promotional examination for Maintenance Supervisor Grounds (PM0597S), Perth Amboy.

The promotional examination was announced with specific requirements which had to be satisfied by the July 21, 2014 closing date (see attached). The examination was cancelled on December 5, 2014, as the appellant and the one other applicant were found ineligible for the examination.

The appellant indicated on his application that he served as a provisional Maintenance Supervisor Grounds from March 2014 to July 2014. Agency Services credited him with five months of general and supervisory experience for that work. The appellant also indicated that he served as an "acting" Supervisor of Roads from August 2013 to March 2014, a Senior Tree Trimmer/ "acting" Road Supervisor from December 2010 to August 2013, a Senior Tree Trimmer from February 2009 to December 2010, and a Tree Trimmer from June 1997 to February 2009. Agency Services did not find any of that experience applicable. Accordingly, Agency Services determined that the appellant lacked two years and seven months of

applicable general experience, and seven months of applicable lead worker or assistant supervisor experience.

On appeal, the appellant argues, among other things, that his experience should be sufficient to qualify him for the examination. Specifically, the appellant asserts that his duties as a Tree Maintenance Worker 2 included assisting the Superintendent in overseeing and taking the lead in the maintenance of grounds, equipment, and operations. In this regard, he asserts that he performed lead worker duties for 13 years while serving in that title. Further, his duties as a Road Repair Supervisor included coordination of daily work assignments, handling work schedules, approving overtime, providing feedback on employee performance, coordinating safety maintenance training, and supervising employees.

In support, the appellant provides a letter from his supervisor, Frank Hoffman, General Supervisor, Public Works. Specifically, Hoffman confirms that the appellant's duties from 1995 to 2010 included taking the lead and performing more complex work in maintaining park grounds, athletic fields, recreational areas, facility grounds, athletic equipment, and other landscaped areas. Hoffman adds that in 2011, 2013, and 2014, the appellant performed the duties of an Assistant Supervisor. In this regard, the appellant's supervisory duties included maintenance of trees, shrubs, bushes, park grounds, athletic fields, recreational areas, facility grounds, and other landscaped lawn areas.

Official personnel records indicate that the appellant continues to serve provisionally in the subject title.

CONCLUSION

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.6(a)2 provides that applicants shall meet all requirements specified in the promotional announcement by the closing date. N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.6(c) provides that, except when permitted for good cause, applicants for promotional examinations with open-competitive requirements may not use experience gained as a result of out-of-title work to satisfy the requirements for admittance to the examination or for credit in the examination process.

Initially, Agency Services correctly credited the appellant with five months of applicable general and lead worker experience for his provisional work in the subject title. Primarily performing the duties required for the title under test would be considered out-of-title work for incumbents in the title of Tree Maintenance Worker 2. However, the appellant's supervisor submitted a letter verifying that he performed the out-of-title work of the subject title since 2011. Further, the appellant continues to serve as a provisional Maintenance Supervisor Grounds. Moreover, the situation is not competitive since there is only one other applicant who was found ineligible for the examination. Accordingly, good cause exists to

accept the appellant's out-of-title work experience, for eligibility purposes only, and admit him to the examination.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this appeal be granted, the cancellation of the examination be rescinded and the appellant's application be processed for prospective employment opportunities only.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
