Andrew Hosonitz appeals the determination of the Division of Agency Services (Agency Services) which found that he did not meet the residency requirement for the open competitive examination for Maintenance Worker 3, Grounds (M0492S), Elizabeth.

:

The subject open competitive examination was announced with specific requirements which had to be met as of the announced closing date of July 7, 2014 (attached). The announcement indicated that it was open to residents of Elizabeth. Thereafter, the appellant received a Notification of Ineligibility (Notice) dated April 8, 2015, indicating his rejection for failure to meet the residency requirement. It is noted that this Notice incorrectly listed that the jurisdiction for the subject examination was Union County.

In the present matter, the appellant argues that he applied for the above listed positon because it indicated Union County. He claims that had it indicated Elizabeth, he would not have applied. Therefore, the appellant requests a refund of his \$25 application fee and his \$20 appeal fee.

CONCLUSION

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-6.3(b) states that, except for disqualification for medical or psychological reasons, the appellant shall have the burden of proof. N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.3(b) provides that applicants shall meet all requirements specified in the open-competitive examination announcement by the closing date. N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.11(c) provides that residency requirements shall be met by the announced closing date for

an examination. Further, *N.J.A.C.* 4A:2-1.8(a) provides, in pertinent part, that a \$20.00 processing fee shall be charged for all appeals and requests for relief filed with the Civil Service Commission, subject to certain exemptions. *N.J.A.C.* 4A:2-1.8(f) states that the fee is for processing purposes only and shall not be refunded for any reason except when submitted in error for an exempt appeal.

In the instant matter, and as indicated in the attached announcement, Elizabeth is correctly listed as the jurisdiction that the examination was open to. It was only the Notice that indicated the incorrect jurisdiction. Therefore, as the announcement was correct and that was what the appellant paid his application fee for, he is not entitled to a refund of his application fee since he was not a resident of Elizabeth as of the closing date. See N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.17(e). Further, as indicated above, the appeal fee is for processing purposes only and shall not be refunded for any reason except when submitted in error for an exempt appeal. In this regard, there is no evidence that the appellant was exempt from this fee. Finally, the appellant cannot benefit from the error on the Notice since no rights are afforded to an individual based on an administrative error. See Cipriano v. Department of Civil Service, 151 N.J. Super. 86 (App. Div. 1977); O'Malley v. Department of Energy, 109 N.J. 309 (1987); HIP of New Jersey v. New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance, 309 N.J. Super. 538 (App. Div. 1998).

Accordingly, based on the foregoing, the appellant has not met his burden of proof, and has not provided a basis to disturb the determination of Agency Services that he was ineligible for the title under test.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this appeal be denied.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
