Matthew Wayde appeals the determination of the Division of Agency Services (Agency Services) that he did not meet the education and experience requirements for the open competitive examination for Senior Mechanic Diesel (C0799T), Monmouth County.

The examination at issue was announced with specific requirements that had to be met as of the November 6, 2015 closing date (see attached). Seven individuals applied for the examination that resulted in three being deemed eligible. Certification OL160274 was issued containing the names of the three eligibles and it was disposed by bypassing one eligible, removing one eligible for not responding to the certification notice, and appointing one eligible. Thereafter, certification OL160582 was issued containing the name of the one remaining eligible. The list expires on March 9, 2019.

On Mr. Wayde's application, he indicated that he was provisionally serving in the title under test from May 2015 to the November 6, 2015 closing date. He also indicated that he possessed some college credits in auto mechanics. Agency Services credited him with having seven months of experience based on his provisional service in the subject title, but determined he did not meet the education requirement and lacked two years and five months of experience.

On appeal, Mr. Wayde contends that there was a "glitch" when submitting his on-line application and that his resume did not go through. He presents that, in addition to his provisional service in the subject title, he was a Bus Technician for Academy Lines from October 2011 to July 2013 and he has over two years of studying mechanical and electrical diagnostics from his community college schooling and earning an Abex Heavy Duty Friction and Brake Training certification.

CONCLUSION

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.3(b)2 requires applicants to possess all the requirements specified in an announcement for an open competitive examination by the closing date.

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.1(f) provides that an applicant may amend a previously submitted application only prior to the announced closing date.

N.J.A.C. 4A:1-1.2(c) provides that a rule may be relaxed for good cause in a particular circumstance in order to effectuate the purposes of Title 11A, New Jersey Statutes.

Initially, Agency Services correctly determined that the appellant was not eligible for the subject examination. The appellant did not indicate on his original application that he had the required education and experience. On appeal, the appellant explains that he believes that there was a "glitch" when he submitted his on-line application and therefore his resume did not go through. He indicates that he has an additional 1 year and 10 months of the required experience by working for Academy Lines as a Bus Technician. He also provides that he has over two years of automotive technology training based on his community college classes and his earning an automotive technology related certification. The importance of submitting a properly completed application that includes all of the necessary information cannot be overstated, since a complete application provides the only reliable barometer by which Agency Services can make the initial determination whether to admit or reject an applicant. Agency Services has no other tool to rely on in order to make this important initial assessment in an expeditious, fair and efficient manner.

Although N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.1(f) proscribes the amendment of an application after the closing date set in the announcement, the Commission notes several circumstances present that provide good cause to permit the appellant to amend his application in this matter. In particular, there are four provisional appointees serving in the subject title and the list only contains the name of one eligible. As such, the eligible list is incomplete. Further, the appellant continues provisionally serving in the subject title. Additionally, Mr. Wayde indicated that he performed maintenance and repair of diesel engine for Academy Lines and he continues to

serve provisionally in the title under test. Accordingly, good cause is established to relax the provisions of *N.J.A.C.* 4A:4-2.1(f) and admit the appellant to the subject examination. It is noted that this determination is limited to the instant matter and does not provide precedent in any other matter.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that the appeal be granted, and Mr. Wayde's application be processed for prospective employment opportunities only.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
