FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

In the Matter of Mark Hoagland and Mark Klosinski, Network Administrator 1, OIT (PS2426U), Office of Information Technology

CSC Docket Nos. 2017-124 and 2017-125

Examination Appeals

Mark Hoagland and Mark Klosinski appeal the determinations of the Division of Agency Services (Agency Services) that they did not meet the education requirement for the promotional examination for Network Administrator 1, OIT (PS2426U), Office of Information Technology. These appeals have been consolidated due to common issues presented.

The examination at issue was announced with specific requirements that had to be met as of the March 21, 2016 closing date (see attached). A total of 18 employees applied for the examination and seven appeared on the resultant eligible list. From certification PS160885, four eligibles were appointed, one was bypassed, and two were removed from the list. The list expires on June 22, 2019.

Mr. Hoagland did not indicate on his application that he possessed a Bachelor's degree. He indicated that he attended numerous computer science/information technology training classes. He further indicated that he served in various information technology positions from October 1989 to the March 21, 2016 closing date, including provisionally serving in the subject title from June 2013 to March 21, 2016. Personnel records indicate that he provisionally served in the subject title from December 15, 2012 to October 15, 2016¹ and then was

returned to his permanent title of Technical Support Specialist 1. Agency Services credited him with having met the experience requirement, but determined that he lacked a Bachelor's degree with 18 math or computer science credits from an accredited institution.

Mr. Klosinski did not indicate on his application that he possessed a Bachelor's degree. He indicated on his application that he had 66 college credits although his transcript shows that he possessed 27 credits. Mr. Klosinski further indicated that he served in various information technology positions from July 1999 to the March 21, 2016 closing date, including provisionally serving in the subject title from October 2012 to the closing date. Personnel records indicate that he provisionally served in the subject title from June 12, 2012 to October 15, 2016 and was returned to his permanent title of Telecommunication Systems Analyst 3. Agency Services credited him with having met the experience requirement, but determined that he lacked a Bachelor's degree with 18 math or computer science credits from an accredited institution.

On appeal, Mr. Hoagland lists the computer science related classes he has taken since 1999. He presents that these classes totaled 352 hours. The vendors for these classes were Cisco, Skyline, Global Solutions, Net G, and Siemon Cable. Mr. Hoagland contends that these classes are the equivalent of 22 college credits. He highlights that he has worked in computer networking for over 26 years and served provisionally in the subject title for 3 years. He attaches his most recent Performance Assessment Reviews (PARs), his resume, and a letter in support of his appeal from David Surro, Director Services Manager.

Mr. Klosinski presents that he has taken 280 hours of network infrastructure training classes and believes that these classes are the equivalent of 17.5 college credits. These classes include Deltak/ACF/VTAM/VTAME Commands in Princeton, Advance Netview Commands, Ethernet Network Analyst, Cisco Router Installation and Configuration, and Fundamentals in Z/OS at the Jack Morton Training Center, and Sniffer Pro Network Analyzer in New Brunswick. He indicates that he has 3 college math credits as shown on his transcript. Mr. Klosinski highlights that he has been working in network services for over 30 years and served provisionally in the subject title for over 4 years. He attaches his last 2 PARs, his resume, his college transcript, and a letter in support of his appeal from Mr. Surro.

CONCLUSION

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.6(a) provides that applicants shall meet all requirements specified in the promotional announcement by the closing date. Further, N.J.A.C.

that a provisional appointee can be removed at any time and does not have a vested property interest in the provisional position. Therefore, there was no basis to grant this request.

4A:1-1.2(c) states that the Civil Service Commission (Commission) may relax a rule for good cause in order to effectuate the purposes of Title 11A, New Jersey Statutes.

Initially, Agency Services correctly determined that the appellants did not meet the required education as they did not submit evidence that they received formal training in Computer Science/Information Technology at accredited institutions. However, it cannot be ignored that the appellants have numerous years of experience and have participated in numerous hours of information technology training. Therefore, although the appellants training does not precisely mirror the education requirements contained in the announcement, the Commission is satisfied that the totality of the appellants' information technology experience and training warrant their admission to the subject examination. Moreover, the list is incomplete as there is only one eligible on the list. Therefore, under these circumstances, good cause exists to relax the provisions of N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.6(a) and accept the totality of appellants' experience and education, and admit them to the subject examination.

It is noted that this remedy is limited to the particular circumstances of this matter and does not set a precedent in any other matter.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that these appeals be granted and Mark Hoagland's and Mark Klosinski's applications be processed for prospective employment opportunities only.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.

Information Technology Specialist

Or to employees in the competitive division who have an aggregate of one year of continuous permanent service as of the closing date in any competitive title and who meet the requirements listed:

Education: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree which must include a minimum of eighteen (18) semester hour credits in Mathematics and/or Computer science. You must indicate the total number of college credits completed to date on your application. You must attach a copy of your transcript to your application. (Foreign degrees/transcripts must be evaluated by a recognized evaluation service.) Failure to do so will result in rejection from the

Experience: Three (3) years of experience in the development, implementation, and maintenance of multi-network, multi-user Local Area Networks (LAN), Metropolitan Area Networks (MAN), Storage Area Networks (SAN), and/or Wide Area Networks (WAN) environments.

Note: Applicants who do not possess the Bachelor's degree but possess the 18 semester hour credits may substitute additional experience as indicated below on a year-foryear basis with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of experience

Note: Evidence of formal training in Computer Science/Information Technology received at an accredited institution may be submitted with your application for evaluation for possible credit. These training courses will be examined to see how they compare, both in hours/content, to college courses to which they equate, sixteen (16) training hours being equal to one (1) college credit.
