Examination Appeal

Karen Storcella appeals the determination of the Division of Agency Services (Agency Services) that she did not meet the experience requirements for the promotional examination for Fiscal Analyst (PS2916U), Department of the Treasury.

The promotional examination was announced with specific requirements which had to be satisfied by the May 23, 2015 closing date (see attached). It noted that applicants who did not possess the required education in one of the specified areas could have substituted additional experience as indicated on a year-for-year basis with 30 semester hour credits being equal to one year of experience. Since the appellant did not indicate that she possessed a Bachelor's degree at the time she submitted the application, she was required to possess five years of applicable experience pursuant to the substitution clause. The examination was cancelled on September 24, 2016 as all of the applicants, including the appellant, were found ineligible for the examination.

A review of official personnel records and the appellant's application reveals that she served as a Technical Assistant 1, Treasury, from October 2014 to the September 21, 2015 closing date, as a Purchasing Assistant from January 2012 through July 2014, as a Technical Assistant 2, Treasury, from December 2004 through January 2012, and as a Technical Assistant 3 from August 2002 to December 2004. She also served as a Senior Clerk Typist from February 2001 to August 2002, and as a Clerk Typist from July 2000 to February 2001. Agency

Services did not find any of the appellant's experience applicable. Accordingly, Agency Services determined that the appellant lacked five years of applicable experience.

On appeal, the appellant argues, among other things, that her experience in her various titles should be sufficient to qualify her for the examination, and she submits new descriptions of duties for the work she performed as a Technical Assistant 1, Treasury, as a Purchasing Assistant, and as a Technical Assistant 2, Treasury.

In support, the appellant provides a copy of a copy of a memorandum from Christopher Chianese, Manager 2, Fiscal Resources, dated May 9, 2011, which recommended at that time that she be promoted to Fiscal Analyst. It also indicates that, as a result of a retirement, the appellant's duties included procuring goods and services, monitoring expenditures, performing monthly projections, and completing detailed reports.

It is noted that the appellant was promoted as a provisional Fiscal Analyst effective June 25, 2016 and she continues to serve in that position.

CONCLUSION

N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.6(a)2 provides that applicants shall meet all requirements specified in the promotional announcement by the closing date. N.J.A.C. 4A:4-2.6(c) provides that, except when permitted for good cause, applicants for promotional examinations with open-competitive requirements may not use experience gained as a result of out-of-title work to satisfy the requirements for admittance to the examination or for credit in the examination process.

In this matter, Agency Services correctly determined that the appellant was ineligible for the subject examination. Primarily performing the required duties to establish eligibility for the subject examination would be considered out-of-title work for incumbents in the Technical Assistant 1, Treasury, Purchasing Assistant, and Technical Assistant 2, Treasury titles. Based on the information provided in the May 9, 2011 letter, including that she was recommended for a promotion to Fiscal Analyst at that time, as well as the description of her out-of-title duties she was performing, the Commission finds the appellant's experience in the titles of Technical Assistant 1, Treasury, Purchasing Assistant, and Technical Assistant 2, Treasury to be applicable. Further, the appellant has been serving as a provisional Fiscal Analyst since June 25, 2016, and she continues to serve in that title. As such, the appellant's out-of-title work experience, in additional to her provisional experience in the subject title, clearly satisfies the subject requirements listed in the announcement. Moreover, the examination was cancelled due to lack of applicants.

Under these circumstances, good cause exists to accept the appellant's out-of-title work experience for eligibility purposes only, and admit her to the examination.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this appeal be granted, the cancellation of the examination be rescinded and the appellant's application be processed for prospective employment opportunities only.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.

Education: Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree. You must indicate either possession of a degree or total number of college credits completed to date on your application. (Foreign degrees/ transcripts must be evaluated by a recognized evaluation service.) Failure to do so will result in rejection from the examination process.

Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional experience as indicated on a year for year basis with thirty (30) semester hour credits being equal to one (1) year of experience.

Experience: One (1) year of experience in the collection, analysis, evaluation, and presentation of financial data used to provide an accurate accounting of administrative and operating costs, and the preparation of reports containing conclusions and recommendations for a private business or government agency.

Note: A Master's degree in Business Administration, Public Administration, Accounting or Finance may be substituted for the one (1) year of experience.
