



On appeal, the appellant describes various facilities that are used for recreation where he was involved in the planning and overseeing the development of these facilities.

### CONCLUSION

A review of the appellant's application indicates that although as a Recreation Leader he was not a supervisor, he was assisting in the planning, promoting, and developing the same recreation programs that he now supervises while serving provisionally in the subject title. Additionally, he has accrued an additional eight months of supervisory experience since the closing date. Further, the list is incomplete as it contains only one eligible. Therefore, the Civil Service Commission finds good cause under *N.J.A.C.* 4A:1-1.2(c) to relax the provisions of *N.J.A.C.* 4A:4-2.6(a) which provides that all requirements for promotional examinations must be met by the closing date, for eligibility purposes only, and admit the appellant to the subject examination.


This determination is limited to the instant matter and does not provide precedent in any other matter.

Therefore, it is ordered that the appeal be granted, and Joseph Pirozek's application be processed for prospective employment opportunities only.
