The appeal of Kimmica Pannell, Records Technician 2, Motor Vehicles, Motor Vehicle Commission, return to previously held permanent title of Technician, Motor Vehicles at the end of the working test period effective July 2, 2019, was heard by Administrative Law Judge Lisa James-Beavers, who rendered her initial decision on December 3, 2019. No exceptions were filed.

Having considered the record and the Administrative Law Judge's initial decision, and having made an independent evaluation of the record, the Civil Service Commission, at its meeting on January 15, 2020, accepted and adopted the Findings of Fact and Conclusion as contained in the attached Administrative Law Judge's initial decision.

STATEMENT OF CASE

Appellant Kimmica Pannell (Pannell) appeals the decision of Respondent Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) dated July 2, 2018 [sic] [2019], which demoted the appellant from Records Technician 3 to her previously held permanent title of Full-time Technician at the end of her working test period (WTP).

PROCEDURAL HISTORY

This matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) on August 5, 2019, for a hearing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 to -15 and N.J.S.A. 52:14F-1 to -13. The settlement conference on August 27, 2019 was adjourned in advance and the September 26, 2019 one was adjourned at the settlement conference. The settlement conference was held on November 26, 2019.

FACTUAL DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

On September 26, 2019, the settlement officer advised Pannell, who had appeared pro se, of her right to counsel. She indicated that she would take the opportunity to obtain counsel. However, on November 26, 2019, Pannell appeared pro se, and submitted a notice of appearance. Following the parties setting forth their respective positions, Pannell offered a two-page letter with attachments, in which she indicated her procedural intentions. She asked that the settlement conference be adjourned and her appeal dismissed without prejudice so that the Federal EEOC could continue its investigations of her cases from 2018 to the present. Pannell's letter is attached hereto as Exhibit P-1. The settlement officer reviewed and accepted her letter. Having reviewed Pannell's letter and the file, I will grant Pannell relief in the form of a dismissal of her WTP appeal without prejudice to her refiling same after the conclusion of the EEOC cases should she deem such action appropriate.

In closing, the record should reflect that the settlement officer thoroughly questioned appellant on November 26, 2019 and concluded that this action on her part was voluntary and her own free act and deed, and that she knew exactly what she was doing and wished to accomplish. I accept his representations of what occurred at the settlement conference.

ORDER

For the above reasons, I ORDER that appellant's request to dismiss her appeal without prejudice is GRANTED.
