The appeal of John Kojza, Repairer, Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, resignation not in good standing effective February 13, 2020, on charges, was heard by Administrative Law Judge Edward J. Delanoy, who rendered his initial decision on December 22, 2020. No exceptions were filed.

Having considered the record and the Administrative Law Judge's initial decision, and having made an independent evaluation of the record, the Civil Service Commission, at its meeting on January 20, 2021, accepted and adopted the attached Administrative Law Judge's initial decision.

The matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), where it was filed on September 3, 2020. Appellant appeals his resignation not in good standing effective February 13, 2020.

Respondent filed a letter brief in support of a motion to dismiss the matter because this matter has been dismissed by the appointing authority, amending the Final Notice of Disciplinary Action to a five-day suspension. On December 17, 2020,

respondent filed an amended letter in support of its motion to dismiss this matter. Because this matter has been downgraded to a minor discipline, the OAL no longer has jurisdiction in the matter.

ORDER

As the OAL no longer has jurisdiction in the matter, It is hereby **ORDERED** that this appeal be **DISMISSED**.

I hereby **FILE** my initial decision with the **CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION** for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the **CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION**, which by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the Civil Service Commission does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10.
