The matter was transmitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), where it was filed on September 3, 2020. Appellant appeals his removal as Repairer with the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs effective July 1, 2020.

Respondent filed a letter brief in support of a motion to dismiss the matter because this matter has been dismissed by the appointing authority, amending the Final Notice of Disciplinary Action to a five-day suspension. On December 17, 2020,

respondent filed an amended letter in support of its motion to dismiss this matter. Because this matter has been downgraded to a minor discipline, the OAL no longer has jurisdiction in the matter.

ORDER

As the OAL no longer has jurisdiction in the matter, It is hereby **ORDERED** that this appeal be **DISMISSED**.

I hereby FILE my initial decision with the CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION for consideration.

This recommended decision may be adopted, modified or rejected by the CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, which by law is authorized to make a final decision in this matter. If the Civil Service Commission does not adopt, modify or reject this decision within forty-five days and unless such time limit is otherwise extended, this recommended decision shall become a final decision in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-10.
