In the Matter of Zavian Bryant and Nicholas Lonero, Police Sergeant (PM0871V), South Orange

FINAL ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

CSC Docket Nos. 2023-316 and 2023-582

Administrative Appeal

ISSUED: September 21, 2022 (JH)

The Township of South Orange Village requests that the list for Police Sergeant (PM0871V), South Orange, be revived in order to effectuate the appointments of Zavian Bryant and Nicholas Lonero.

By way of background, the subject list, which contained the names of 11 eligibles, promulgated on May 24, 2018 and expired on May 23, 2022. Bryant and Lonero appear at ranks 9 and 11, respectively, on the subject eligible list. Effective June 4, 2021, the fifth and last certification was issued from the PM0871V eligible list (Certification No. PL210525). In disposing of PL210525, which contained the

² Effective April 1, 2019, the first certification was issued from the PM0871V eligible list (Certification No. PL190435). In disposing of PL190435, which contained the names of the first five eligibles, South Orange appointed the third and fourth ranked eligibles effective April 22, 2019. The second certification was issued effective January 3, 2020 and contained the names of the eligibles appearing at ranks 5 through 9 (Certification No. PL200005). In disposing of PL200005, South Orange appointed the fifth ranked eligible effective January 27, 2020. Effective July 24, 2020, the third certification was issued, which contained the names of the eligibles appearing at ranks 6 through 8 (Certification No. PL200691). In disposing of PL200691, South Orange appointed the sixth ranked eligible effective August 10, 2020. The fourth certification was issued effective January 11, 2021 and contained the names of the eligibles appearing at ranks 7 through 9 (Certification No. PL210023). In disposing of PL210023, South Orange appointed the seventh ranked eligible effective January 11, 2021.

names of the eligibles who appeared at ranks 8 through 10, South Orange appointed the eligible appearing at rank 8 effective June 14, 2021.

In its request, the appointing authority indicates that "South Orange is currently undergoing a significant amount of transition, both our Police Department and our Administration." In this regard, the appointing authority explains that when Police Chief Ernesto Morillo was appointed on March 31, 2022, his top priority was to address the shortage of officers in the department and he "was well aware that we had officers working as Sergeants to address the shortage of supervisors, however, he also understood that we could not promote until we backfilled the shortage of officers [pursuant to N.J.S.A. 11A:4-1.3] . . . A short staff was the ONLY REASON they were not promoted sooner, we cannot stress this point enough." The appointing authority notes that the Chief "had every intention of promoting these officers to Sergean[t], and was working toward backfilling the police department as quickly and responsibly as possible. The Mayor of the town was well aware and had approved the promotions as well as then Business Administrator Adam Loehner." The appointing authority explains that Bryant and Lonero, "two of our most senior patrol officers, with 12 years and 22 years respectively," were interviewed on May 13, 2022 and were advised of the intention to promote them to Sergeant. The appointing authority explains that during this time, then Business Administrator Loehner was being interviewed by other municipalities and at the end of May, he announced that he had accepted another job effective July 1, 2022. The appointing authority presents that given that Loehner was in transition, he did not submit a timely certification request. The appointing authority emphasizes that Bryant and Lonero "have gone above and beyond and have performed their duties as Sergeants admirably. To take away a promotion they have earned due to these circumstances would simply not be fair to them."

CONCLUSION

N.J.S.A. 11A:4-6 and *N.J.A.C.* 4A:4-3.4 provide that an expired eligible list may be revived under the following circumstances: 1. To implement a court order, in a suit filed prior to the expiration of the list; 2. To implement an order of the Civil Service Commission in an appeal or proceeding instituted during the life of the list; 3. To correct an administrative error; 4. To effect the appointment of an eligible whose working test period was terminated by a layoff; or 5. For other good cause. *See N.J.S.A.* 11:4-6.

In the instant matter, the record establishes that the appointing authority had bona fide vacancies and intended to promote Bryant and Lonero to Police Sergeant prior to the May 23, 2022 expiration date of the PM0871V list. See In the Matter of

William J. Brennan and Fire Lieutenant (PM1201T) and Fire Captain (PM1191T), Township of Teaneck (MSB, decided April 9, 2003). However, due to administrative error, a request for certification was not submitted prior to the expiration date. Nevertheless, had the appointing authority requested a certification at that time, Bryant and Lonero would have been listed in the first and third positions on the certification, respectively, and reachable for appointment under N.J.A.C. 4A:4-4.8. Under these circumstances, good cause has been presented to revive the Police Sergeant (PM0871V), South Orange list to permit the issuance of a single certification from the list in order to effectuate the regular appointments of Bryant and Lonero. It is noted that during the appeal process, South Orange was contacted regarding this matter and indicated that to date, Bryant and Lonero have not assumed the duties of a Police Sergeant. Accordingly, their appointment dates should be recorded as of the date that they actually begin to perform Police Sergeant duties.

ORDER

Therefore, it is ordered that this request be granted and the Police Sergeant (PM0871V), South Orange eligible list be revived in order to permit the issuance of a single certification from the list in order to effectuate the permanent appointments of Bryant and Lonero to the Police Sergeant title.

This is the final administrative determination in this matter. Any further review should be pursued in a judicial forum.
