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Subject: Group Classifications for Residential and Institutional Occupancies Reference: Chapter 3 of the Building Subcode, N.J.A.C. 5:23-3.14

The chart included in this Bulletin is intended to assist in determining the correct group designation for residential occupancies. The defining criteria for making this determination are number of occupants, the ability of those occupants to evacuate and whether the occupants are transient. Determination of the group designation is separate from the determination as to whether a given facility is subject to the Rooming and Boarding House Act or the Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Act. For example, a single-family home with two or more units (rooms) arranged for single-room occupancy is subject to licensure under the Rooming and Boarding House Act notwithstanding the fact that it may be properly classified as Group R-3 or Group R-5.

With the adoption of the 2015 International Building Code (IBC) as the building subcode of the Uniform Construction Code, the Department has made as few amendments as possible to the group designations as defined in the IBC. The biggest change resulting from this adoption is in the use of Group R-4 for facilities with six to sixteen occupants which would previously have been classified as Group I-1.
