Overall Progress Narrative:

The State of New Jersey (State), Disaster Recovery and Mitigation Division (DRM), Department of Community Affairs (DCA), as the grantee of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding allocated to New Jersey by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for Tropical Storm Ida (Ida) recovery, has prepared this Quarterly Performance Report (QPR) addressing CDBG-DR funding and expenditures. This is the first QPR and covers not only the second quarter of 2023 (April through June) but also the first quarter (January through May). The Tropical Storm Ida Action Plan was approved by HUD on November 1, 2022. Though the State of New Jersey has not expended direct dollars in support of this Action Plan, programs, policies, and procedures have been developed for the programs identified with the Public Action and most of these programs have launched with DCA currently reviewing applications. To further support the recovery of those impacted by Ida, a portion of the Sandy CDBG-DR is being used by DCA to implement some of the programs. Interchangeability allows DCA to use Sandy CDBG-DR in the overlapping HUD MID

Interchangeability allows DCA to use Sandy CDBG-DR in the overlapping HUD MID areas for recovery. The Action Plan and all amendments are available in English and Spanish on DCAâ¿¿s website https://www.nj.gov/dca/ddrm/. In the second quarter of 2023, HUD approved Ida CDBG-DR Action Plan Non-Substantial Amendment 1. Action Plan Substantial Amendment 2 has been submitted to HUD and is under review.

Amendment 1 was considered non-substantial since the clarifications and additions did not involve a new allocation or transfer of funds above the threshold between programs, did not create a new program, and did not change program beneficiaries or eligibility criteria. The amendment process followed the guidance in the applicable Federal Register notice related to non-substantial amendments and was posted on the DCA website in accordance with HUD requirements. This amendment provided modifications to program areas identified during program policy development. Those programs are as follows:

• Homeowner Assistance and Recovery Program (HARP) by modifying applicant program pathways.

• Smart Move by changing the program start date.

• Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) by removing the requirement to provide moving.

Resilient Communities by changing technical assistance to an optional service.
Resilient NJ by changing the program start date.

Amendment 2 was considered substantial since it was to modify program-eligible activities and change program eligibility criteria for programs and applicants. The amendment process followed the guidance in the applicable Federal Register notice related to substantial amendments and was posted on the DCA website in



accordance with HUD requirements. The public comment period for APA 2 was open from 9 a.m. on April 24, 2023, to 5:00 p.m. on May 25, 2023. This amendment modifies eligible activities in the following programs:

• Blue Acres by changing safe housing incentives eligibility.

• Small Rental Repair Program by removing reconstruction as an eligible activity.

 Resilient Communities Program by removing comprehensive planning as an eligible activity.

 Resilient NI program by removing municipalities as stand-alone eligible applicants to the program and adding counties and regional consulting teams. The following report highlights the Stateâ¿¿s continued progress in executing CDBG-DR recovery programs.

Grantee Program Progress Narratives

Blue Acres

Blue Acres is a voluntary buyout and incentive program that will acquire properties located in the floodway, floodplain, or other Disaster Risk Reduction Area that reduce the risk from future flooding. The program policies, procedures, and application materials have been completed. The applications were available from May 9, 2023, to June 22, 2023. Although applications have not been reviewed yet, there are potentially 400 households within the HUD- and State-declared MID areas that are interested in participating in the program and relocating to safer living conditions.

FEMA Non-Federal Cost Share

This program funds the non-federal cost share for State and local facilities eligible under FEMAâ¿¿s Public Assistance program to help offset the burden of the nonfederal share requirements faced by those entities. This program has not yet launched, and n funding has been.

Homeowner Assistance and Recovery Program

The Homeowner Assistance and Recovery Program (HARP) provides grants for activities necessary to restore storm-damaged homes, including rehabilitation, reconstruction, elevation, and/or other mitigation activities. The program policies, procedures, and application materials have been completed and in late February 2023, DCA opened appications for launch. The application window closed on May 1, 2023. DCA received 2,222 applications with 2,198 applications from homeowners in the HUD and State MID areas. Out of the received applications, 24 were from homeowners located in ineligible counties. Applications are currently being reviewed for eligibility and DCA will fund these applications in phases, with phase 1 (Less than 80% of Area Median Income and above age 62 or disability in a household) receiving priority.

Housing Counseling and Legal Services

This program was developed by DCA to offer grants to subrecipients to deliver critical supportive services and provide a wide range of counseling services to both renters and homeowners impacted by Tropical Storm Ida. The program policies and intake procedures are complete for the Housing Counseling and Legal Services Program which launched on February 27, 2023. It is anticipated that many applicants from the Homeowner Assistance and Recovery Program (HARP) and the Small Rental Repair Program (SRRP) will need the services provided by this program. Since the launch of HARP and SRRP, DCA has received over 2,300 applications and expects most will need Housing Counseling and/or Legal Services.

Resilient Communities Program

This competitive program provides funding for infrastructure projects that will help impacted communities become more resilient to current and future natural hazards. The State has modeled this program on FEMAâ¿¿s Building Resilient Infrastructure in Communities (BRIC) program. The Resilient Communities Program policies are complete. DCA is currently working on application materials and the applicant registration portal. The launch date for the program was. The State will also be providing an application webinar to assist those that are interested in applying to the Resilient Communities Program.

Resilient New Jersey

This program will make direct allocations to units of general local governments,



planning. The program policies are in progress and the anticipated launch date will be Quarter 1 of 2024.

Small Rental Repair Program

The Small Rental Recovery Program (SRRP) is designed to assist storm-impacted owners and renters of rental properties. The program provides assistance for activities necessary to restore storm-damaged homes, including rehabilitation, elevation, and/or other mitigation activities. The program policies and procedures have been completed and in late February 2023, DCA opened applications to SRRP. The application window closed on June 5, 2023, with the program receiving 189 applications. Applications are currently being reviewed for eligibility and DCA will fund these applications in phases, with phase 1 (original owner with 1-4 units) receiving priority.

Smart Move: New Housing Development

The Smart Move program subsidizes new development of quality, energy-efficient, resilient, and affordable housing in lower-risk areas out of the floodplain within or near disaster-impacted communities participating in Blue Acres or other buyout programs supported by different funding sources. The development of the Smart Move program policies are underway with Phase 1: Housing Development completed and Phase II: Homeowner Occupancy in progress. The anticipated launch of this program is in Quarter 3, 2023.

Statewide Housing Mitigation Strategy Tool

The Statewide Housing Mitigation Strategy Tool will assess the housing stock in disaster-impacted and at-risk areas that includes such components as taking inventory of housing by type, risk, accessibility, and other components needed to understand community and regional residential vulnerabilities. Tenant-Based Rental Assistance

Through the Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) program, the State will supplement rental housing costs for rental families making up to 120% of AMI impacted by Tropical Storm Ida, thereby making rental housing more affordable. The program policies and procedures have been completed and in late February 2023, DCA opened for pre-applications. The program accepted pre-applications until June 1, 2023, with a total of 4,141 pre-applications received. Eligible applicants are being referred to housing counseling agencies for assistance in completing the full applications. Applications will be reviewed by DRM personnel for voucher processing.

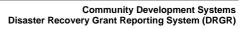
