Narratives

Disaster Damage:

Housing:

New Jersey's CDBG-DR Action Plan detailed the substantial damage that Superstorm Sandy caused to the State's housing sector. While damage from Superstorm Sandy occurred throughout the state, housing damage was particularly concentrated in communities bordering or near the Atlantic Ocean or the Hudson River. Many of these communities were flooded by Sandy's storm surge. FEMA Individual Assistance data as of March 12, 2013 reflected that the greatest concentrations of housing damage were located in the following counties: Atlantic (12%),

Bergen (5%), Cape May (4%), Essex (2%), Hudson (6%), Middlesex (5%), Monmouth (16%), Ocean (35%) and Union (6%). Superstorm Sandy significantly affected both homeowner and rental properties. Based on FEMA Individual Assistance data effective March 12, 2013, approximately 40,500 owners' primary residences and over 15,600 rental units sustained "severe" or "major" damage according to classifications made by HUD. Moreover, many residences were "substantially damaged," meaning that damages exceed 50% of the homes pre-disaster value. In total, the FEMA data from March 12, 2013 indicated that 59,971 owner-occupied homes and 21,900 rental units sustained some level of physical damage from the storm. As referenced in the State's Action Plan, these figures likely underestimate the breadth of Superstorm Sandy's impact on the housing sector. The storm's impact on low- to moderate-income (LMI) households in New Jersey was particularly pronounced. FEMA Individual Assistance data as of March 12, 2013 demonstrated that of applicants who reported major or severe damage to their homes, 49% were LMI households. Moreover, 74% of renters that reported damage to their homes to FEMA were LMI households. While LMI households throughout the State were affected by the storm, the most impacted LMI households generally were within the counties with the greatest concentrations of damage, identified above. Economic Development:

Superstorm Sandy devastated many businesses in New Jersey, causing substantial commercial property damage and short-term and longterm business operations losses. In addition to the physical damage Sandy caused to businesses themselves, widespread power outages resulted in inventory losses and working capital losses. Damage to public infrastructure such as roads, rail and bridges as well as compromised water utility systems and gas unavailability compounded those damages. This explains why data compiled soon after the storm suggested that businesses within 113 of New Jersey's 565 municipalities incurred a combined \$382,000,000 in commercial property losses and another \$63,900,000 in business interruption losses. While Superstorm Sandy caused damage across all state industries, some industries -- particularly the tourism industry -- were substantially affected. The storm also is estimated to have affected over 1,000,000 employees in New Jersey's workforce. Data compiled in the months after the storm indicates that approximately 138,000 workers filed unemployment claims in November 2012, the first full month after Superstorm Sandy. By comparison, unem ployment claims in November 2011 totaled 54,444 claims.

Infrastructure:

Superstorm Sandy's storm surge and associated flooding extensively impacted New Jersey's infrastructure. Critical facilities and assets throughout the State were directly damaged. Sandy left nearly seventy percent of ratepayers statewide withoutelectricity. Water and wastewater treatment facilities were unable to sustain operations. Roadways experienced significant damage from extensive flooding and sustained winds resulted in debris that made critical evacuation routes impassable. Rail and other public transitsystems, which suspended operations in anticipation of the storm, were substantially damaged.

Recovery Needs:

Housing:

New Jersey estimated in its Action Plan an unmet need in the housing sector totaling \$2,504,993,992. The State calculated that figure by adding estimated repair and replacement costs and estimated costs for required elevations to reach a total need figure. The State then

subtracted funding provided from other sources such as private insurance, FEMA, and SBA, to reach the unmet need. As



stated in the Action Plan, this figure likely understates the extent of New Jersey's housing needs.

New Jersey estimated in its Action Plan an unmet need in the economic sector of \$1,727,813,413. The State calculated that figure by adding estimated commercial losses and business interruption losses to arrive at a total need figure. The State then subtracted funding provided from other sources, such as commercial insurance and SBA. As stated in the Action Plan, this figure does not account for long-term losses or systemic impacts to the State's key economic base, notably the tourism and coastal real estate market. As a result, this figure likely understates the extent of New Jersey's needs in the economic sector.

Infrastructure:

New Jersey estimated in its Action Plan an unmet need in the infrastructure sector of \$25,432,594,266. The State calculated that figure by adding estimated damage costs to needed hazard mitigation measures to arrive at a total need figure. The State then subtracted funding provided from other sources, such as FEMA Public Assistance. As stated in the Action Plan, these figures are preliminary and subject to change. Affirmatively Further Fair Housing:

The State is committed to affirmatively further fair housing through its housing programs, following all applicable federal and state statutes and regulations, and enforcing fair housing laws. The State will ensure that housing assistance relating to Superstorm Sandy recovery is

prioritized and allocated solely based on disaster-related need, without regard to raise or ethnicity. Information relating to demographics of impacted communities will be utilized to ensure that assistance is accessible and reaches New Jerseyans in need. In support, the State,

among other things, has stood up household assistance centers in each of the nine most impacted counties to assist residence and communities with recovery programs and the application process.

Overall Progress Narrative: Summary for Fourth Quarter 2023 QPR:

The State of New Jersey (State), Department of Community Affairs (DCA), as the grantee of Community Development Block Grantâ¿Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding allocated to New Jersey by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for Superstorm Sandy (Sandy) recovery, has prepared this Quarterly Performance Report (QPR) addressing CDBG-DR funding and expenditures through the fourth quarter of 2023 (October through December).

This QPR illustrates that, through December 31, 2023, the State expended more than \$3.657B in CDBG-DR funds, and approximately \$40.9M Program Income (PI). As of the fourth quarter of 2023, the total CDBG-DR expenditures for low-to-moderate (LMI) populations in New Jersey account for approximately 56.8 percent of the Stateâ¿¿s total CDBG-DR expenditures.

In the fourth quarter of 2023, the State submitted Superstorm Sandy CDBG-DR Action Plan Amendment 53, which is a substantial amendment, to HUD for review. The amendment was effective on December 22, 2023.

APA 53 reallocates Superstorm Sandy CDBG-DR funds to the Rebuild by Design program, specifically the Rebuild by Design Hudson River Project, which is an urban stormwater management strategy intended to address impacts from coastal storm surge flooding as well as systemic inland rainfall flooding seen in low-lying areas of Hoboken and parts of Weehawken and Jersey City during Superstorm Sandy. The transfer of these funds will help ensure the project meets its goal of protecting life and property in the impacted area. Under APA 53, the State is also transferring Sandy CDBG-DR funds to the Resilient NJ â¿¿ Regional Resilience Planning Grant Program, which is funding the development of creative and implementable approaches to regional resilience planning. With the additional funds, the program will expand to serve both Superstorm Sandy and Hurricane Ida disaster areas and allow more communities to receive funds for resilient planning. Finally, this amendment reallocates funding to the Homeowner Assistance and Recovery Program (HARP) and the Statewide Housing Mitigation Tool program. The State has been awarded CDBG-DR funds for both Superstorm Sandy and Hurricane Ida, making the State eligible to use the funds interchangeably for programs that benefit counties impacted by both storm disasters.



The State also submitted Superstorm Sandy CDBG-DR Action Plan Amendment 54, which is a substantial amendment, to HUD for review in the fourth quarter of 2023. APA 54 clarifies the Stateâ¿s housing recovery programs for certain areas of Manville and to the damage threshold for the Homeowner Assistance and Recovery Program (HARP).

DCAâ¿¿s Division of Disaster Recovery and Mitigation (DRM) has and will continue to take meaningful actions to address significant disparities in housing needs while fostering and maintaining compliance with civil rights and fair housing laws. DRM has institutionalized in practice, and codified in policies and procedures, compliance with the fair housing tenets that were initially established under the Voluntary Compliance Agreement (VCA) enacted in 2015.

Those efforts included the opportunity made through the New Jersey Housing Mortgage and Finance Agency (NJHMFA) to provide grant assistance to public housing authorities and owners of federally assisted rental properties to repair damage from Superstorm Sandy, a targeted investment in Special Needs Housing, and funding for thousands of units of affordable large multi-family housing.

The Sandy Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) Program served 1,788 renters while Housing Counseling Services (HCS) served more than 16,000 residents, both tenants and homeowners. HCS, through community-based and grassroot organizations, ensured that all citizens had access to civil rights and fair housing information. In addition, all programs and services make a commitment to serve those citizens with limited English proficiency and to diligently implement Section 3 hiring.

New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy recently signed into law Bill S3110/A4783, which also affirmatively furthers fair housing. The new law makes New Jersey the 30th state to require disclosures from landlords and home sellers that better inform renters and homebuyers of the flood risk they face. To implement the law, the State has published new property disclosure forms notifying prospective homebuyers and tenants of a propertyâ¿¿s known flood history and potential floodrisks, as ell as launched a user-friendly internet look-up too searchable by mailing address that identifies properties in flood hazard areas. Pursuant to the law, sellers and landlords will be required to use the new forms, which are now available on the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs and DCA websites, beginning on March 20, 2024. Efforts like this will minimize the disparate impact of low- to moderate-income homeownership in climate vulnerable communities.

The following report highlights the Stateâ¿¿s continued progress in executing CDBG-DR recovery programs.

1. HOUSING RECOVERY ACTIVITIES:

The RREM Program provides grants of up to \$150,000 to eligible, Sandy-impacted homeowners to reconstruct, repair, elevate or undertake mitigation measures for their storm-damaged primary homes. As of December 31, 2023, 6,981 participants in the RREM Program had completed construction. Only a few dozen homeowners are still in process of completing construction. Also, more than \$951M of RREM funding was disbursed to eligible participants.

The Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) Homeowner Rebuilding Program provides reconstruction, rehabilitation, elevation, and mitigation assistance of up to \$150,000 to LMI homeowners whose primary residences were damaged by Superstorm Sandy but who did not apply to the RREM Program. The LMI Program includes a reserve of funding for owners of manufactured housing units/mobile homes to ensure that this group receives needed assistance. As of December 31, 2023, 263 projects had completed construction and nearly \$38M in program funding had been disbursed to eligible participants.



The Supplemental Fund is exclusively for homeowners in the above-mentioned RREM Program and the LMI Program who have a program-calculated unmet need and who have yet to complete construction. As of December 31, 2023, 91 Supplemental Fund awards were in various stages of processing; this includes 61 in closeout.

Storm-impacted households are served through the Sandy Recovery Housing Counseling Program, which provides free HUD-certified housing guidance through community-based nonprofit housing counseling agencies on a wide array of issues, including foreclosure, homelessness prevention, budgeting, rental guidance, and utility help. As of the fourth quarter of 202, more than 16,800 Sandy-impacted households of low-to-moderate income received housing counseling services through the program and approximately \$12.6 million was expended.

To assist Sandy-impacted homeowners who face frequent flooding, the State is administering the Sandy Blue Acres Buyout Program in part with CDBG-DR funds. Blue Acres helps New Jersey families in flood zones move out of harmâ¿¿s way and enhances community flood resiliency. With respect to CDBG-DR funds, buyouts are underway in 13 municipalities (Keansburg, Linden, Manalapan, Manville, New Milford, Ocean Township, Old Bridge, Pemberton, Pleasantville, Rahway, Southampton, South River, and Woodbridge). The Program reports acquisition and demolition activities for 199 properties as of December 31, 2023.

The State also continues to create affordable rental units and serve rentersâ¿¿ recovery needs:

- The Stateâ¿¿s largest affordable rental housing Sandy recovery initiative is the Fund for Restoration of Multifamily Housing (FRM) Program. During the first 90 days of lease-up for any FRM-funded project, developers must prioritize Sandy-impacted households who apply. As of December 31, 2023, 84 out of 85 FRM-funded projects were complete, creating approximately 6,699 units. The State awarded \$30M in FRM funding to nine public housing authority projects, all of which completed construction.
- The Sandy Special Needs Housing Fund (SSNHF) provides funding for permanent supportive rental housing units for special needs populations. Funds were awarded to 53 projects that created approximately 440 households for individuals with special needs. All construction is complete.
- The Neighborhood Enhancement Program (NEP) returns abandoned or blighted housing to viability. To achieve this, NEP provides no-interest loans to eligible developers to purchase and rehabilitate properties in counties most impacted by Sandy. DCA has awarded NEP loans to 42 projects (185 housing units). As of December 31, 2023, all 42 projects were completed and occupied, providing 149 rental units and 36 homeowner units.

1. ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND REVITALIZATION ACTIVITIES:

The Stronger NJ Business Loan Program, which provides loans of up to \$5M to storm-impacted businesses, approved \$87.2M in loans for 123 businesses as of the fourth quarter of 2023. Of these businesses, 117 are fully disbursed. To date, \$84.2M has been disbursed to businesses.

The Stronger NJ Business Grant Program awards grants of up to \$50,000 to storm-affected businesses. As of December 31, 2023, 1,150 small businesses have been approved for and received grants totaling \$55.9M. Program Close-Out has been



initiated.

The State also administers the Stronger NJ Neighborhood and Community Revitalization (NCR) Program, which invests in municipal projects through two (2) initiatives: The Streetscape Revitalization Program and the Development & Public Improvement Program (D&I):

- 1. The Streetscape Program consists of 19 unique construction-related projects. All activities have received authorization from HUD to proceed and have executed their subrecipient agreements. At the end of the fourth quarter of 2023, 17 projects are complete, and two projects are currently underway. To date, more than \$14.4M has been disbursed.
- 2. The D&I Program represents 19 construction-related projects, all of which have executed their subrecipient agreements. Two (2) projects are currently underway, 16 projects are complete, and one (1) project had its agreement terminated by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority. Thus far, \$46.1M has been disbursed for D&I projects.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND RESILIENCY ACTIVITIES

The extensive damage and power outages caused by Superstorm Sandy prompted the State to create the Energy Resilience Bank (ERB) to assist critical facilities such as hospitals, water treatment plants and wastewater facilities with securing resilient energy technologies that will transform them â¿¿ and by extension, the communities they serve â¿¿ into less vulnerable to future severe weather events and other emergencies. Through thefourth quarter of 2023, six (6) projects are in construction (South Monmouth Regional Sewage Authority in Wall Township, Bergen County Utilities Authority in Little Ferry, RWJ-Somerset in Somerville, RWJ-NBI in Newark, RWJ-Livingston in Livingston, and RWJ-JCMC in Jersey City). Two (2) projects have completed construction and are in close out (Ocean County Utilities in West Creek and Trinitas Regional Medical Center in Elizabeth). Four (4) projects are complete and fully disbursed (Hunterdon Medical Center in Flemington, St. Peterâ¿¿s University Hospital in New Brunswick, Cooper Health System in Camden, and University Hospital in Newark).

The Flood Hazard Risk Reduction and Resiliency Grant Program consists of an infrastructure component to support communities with flood hazard risk reduction projects and an easement acquisition component to support Army Corps of Engineers flood protection projects on the Shore. Eight infrastructure projects received awards. As of December 31, 2023, projects in Wildwood, Cape May County; Brigantine, Atlantic County; Little Ferry, Bergen County; and Belmar and Spring Lake in Monmouth County are complete. Field work and construction on the project in Atlantic City, Atlantic County has begun. Stone Harbor and North Wildwood in Cape May County are no longer pursuing their projects in light of cost increases. For the easement acquisition component, the State continued in the fourth quarter of 2023 to work with property owners on final compensation either through settlement negotiations or legal actions with counsel. There are two (2) infrastructure projects needing easements for final design, all real estate rights necessary to construct the current programs have been obtained, and projects have been constructed or are being constructed. The final coastal project has begun the acquisition process and construction will begin in a few years.

TheState is also adminitering two (2) projects developed through HUDâ¿¿s Rbuild By Design (RBD) competition: â¿¿Meadowlands Flood Protection Projectâ¿ and â¿¿Resist, Delay, Store, Discharge Hudson River Project.â¿:

1. During the fourth quarter of 2023, the RBD Meadowlands Project Team: (1) started construction of the Liberty Street Pumping Station and Force Main Project; (2) continued to secure permits and approvals needed for the East Riser Ditch Pumping Station Project; and (3) continued working on the design of the East Riser



Ditch Channel Improvements project.

2. During the fourth quarter of 2023, initial construction work continued on the flood resist project of RBD Hudson River, which includes Hoboken and parts of Jersey City and Weehawken. Current field work includes the performance of test pits throughout the project area to locate subsurface conflicts that may exist with the structure. The fourth quarter included submission of contractor plans and other submittals required before heavy construction begins. The construction phase of the Resist contract is expected to take approximately four (4) years. Hobokenowned and Hudson County property easements have been secured. Additional private property easements have been secured in Weehawken and an eminent domain taking was completed in Jersey City. Other public easement acquisition continues for the Resist project.

1. SECTION 3

DCA is making the following efforts to help meet its Section 3 goals:

- Ensure that Section 3 requirements are outlined in all applicable contracts and subrecipient agreements.
- Build the capacity of stakeholders, including subrecipients and contractors, to meet Section 3 standards through technical assistance, tools, and guidance.
- Designate a Section 3 coordinator who manages, supports, and facilitates an effective Section 3 program, and who is able to effectively communicate program requirements to stakeholders.

DCA will report Section 3 accomplishments in the Disaster Recovery Grant Reporting system. Recovery programs implemented by DCA and its subrecipients will incorporate uniform best practices of construction standards for all construction contractors performing work in all relevant jurisdictions. As required in 2 CFR 200.321, DCA will take all necessary steps to ensure that minority-owned businesses and women-owned business enterprises are used when possible.

The Hudson River project, known as the Resist, Delay, Store, Discharge project, is a comprehensive urban water strategy that would deploy programmed hard infrastructure and soft landscape for coastal defense (resist); generate policy recommendations, guidelines and urban infrastructure to slow rainwater runoff (delay); develop a circuit of interconnected green infrastructure to store and direct excess rainwater (store); and deploy water pumps and alternative routes to support drainage (discharge). As proposed, a variety of flood risk reduction infrastructure will be built along the Hudson River in order to reduce flood waters, including at Weehawken Cove (to protect Hoboken, Weehawken and critical regional utilities) and by the Hoboken Ferry Terminal.
