

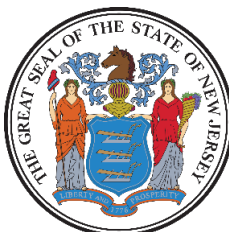

SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

The purpose of this **Action Plan Amendment (APA) Number 3** to the State's Action Plan, (approved by HUD on November 21, 2022) is to provide non-substantial changes to the identified program area as detailed in this document. This amendment is considered non-substantial since the changes do not involve a new allocation or transfer/re-allocation of funds above the threshold between programs, do not create a new program, and do not change program beneficiaries or eligibility criteria. The amendment process follows the guidance in the applicable Federal Register notice related to non-substantial amendments and will be posted on the DCA website in accordance with HUD requirements.

SECTION 2: ACTION PLAN CLARIFICATIONS

A. Modification to Section 4.8.76 Resilient Communities by removing the minimum grant award.

In the initial action plan, the State established minimum program assistance of \$500,000.

During the program policy development, changes were made to eliminate the minimum assistance amount. Additional outreach by the State determined that multiple jurisdictions have other sources of funding and only need funds to close a small finance gap. There will still be a maximum award cap of \$5 million.

Edit in Section 4.8.76 of Ida Action Plan is as follows:

The **{delete}** minimum program assistance available is \$500,000 and the maximum assistance available is \$5 million.
