In addition, the code uses smoke resistant assemblies to limit the spread of smoke within a building and the dangers it would create for the occupants. Any opening or penetration within the rated assemblies has the potential to reduce the assembly's performance. This course focuses on the protection provided by dampers, penetration firestops and joint systems to ensure the building and occupants are safe. 0.5 CEU

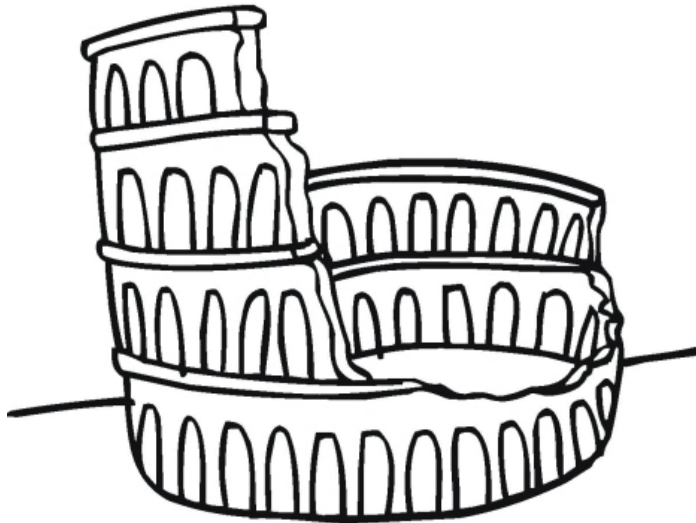
the code official. Discussions will include the requirements relating to both new and rehabilitation projects. 0.5 CEU
