The fire hydrant will soon be the center of attention as the Senate takes up <u>S 2254</u> which passed the Assembly last year. The bill, sponsored by Senator Jim Whelan (D-2), requires municipalities, water utilities and abutting property

owners to clear and mark hydrants.

Hydrants have existed in some form since their inception as a "plug" in the wooden water mains of 18th Century. The "plug" was the repair made to the main after a hole was cut to fight a fire. The term "plug-ugly" came from the hearty fellows who guarded a plug for the fire company against its use by another competing fire company. Benjamin Franklin put an end to this practice.
