INTRODUCTION

FIRE IN NEW JERSEY 2004 AND 2005 summarizes the last two years of the fire experience in New Jersey as reported by fire departments that participate in the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS). The purpose of this report is to raise awareness of the impact that fire has on our state. Once the problems are identified steps can be taken to solve them. In addition to describing the fire problem, the data in this report shows that fire department personnel respond to a wide range of emergencies. In many communities throughout the state fire departments are first responders to emergency medical calls, motor vehicle and industrial accidents, hazardous materials incidents, and other potential life threatening emergencies.

Firefighters and fire officers, both career and volunteer, are responsible for the data in this report. They are the ones who complete the necessary reports documenting the incidents to which their fire department responds. The Division of Fire Safety is grateful to these dedicated individuals.

The Division of Fire Safety NFIRS staff should be acknowledged for their hard work and dedication. Sonia Salva, technical support specialist, processes the incident data into the New Jersey and Federal NFIRS databases. Fred Connin, Ron Svrcek, and Steven Hearn serve as field representatives and spend countless hours during the day and in the evening helping fire departments implement the NFIRS.

NFIRS BACKGROUND

The Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-948) authorized the National Fire Data Center in the United States Fire Administration (USFA) to gather and analyze information on the frequency, cause, spread, and extinguishment of fires; on the number, nature and causes of injuries and deaths resulting from fires and on property loss. The National Fire Information Council (NFIC) was organized to promote and manage the data collection effort through a cooperative agreement with the USFA. The NFIC is made up of representatives of participating states and metropolitan cities as well as individuals and organizations who support the NFIRS. In New Jersey, the Division of Fire Safety in the Department of Community Affairs has the responsibility for coordinating the data collection effort and is the representative to the NFIC.

USES OF NFIRS DATA

NFIRS data is a definite source for fire departments to assess their fire prevention efforts, improve their training and education, and assist with the justification of budget requests. Fire departments have been able to secure funding to offset the cost of apparatus using the NFIRS by identifying where fires were occurring in their jurisdiction.

States use the data to justify changes to the fire prevention code, identify firefighter training needs, and provide information for public fire education programs. The data can be analyzed to identify trends that are not apparent at the local fire department level.

In addition to providing an excellent source of data to evaluate the fire problem on the local and state level, data from the NFIRS are used extensively at the federal level. The USFA uses the data to set program priorities and target fire prevention campaigns. The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) uses the data to identify possible product defects. Some examples of areas that have been targeted for special studies by the CPSC are products such as portable space heaters, wood stoves, upholstered furniture and cigarette lighters.



FIRE INCIDENT REPORTING IN NEW JERSEY

Data used in this report was provided by fire departments that participate in the NFIRS. The statutes that created the Division of Fire Safety call for the Division to administer a fire incident reporting system in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-25d.(d.). To encourage participation, the Division of Fire Safety provides training, reference materials, incident field notes, and software to fire departments. The incident data that fire departments submit to the Division is forwarded to the National Fire Data Center at the United States Fire Administration. The Division began implementation of NFIRS (version) 5 in 1999. Most of the data used in this report is from NFIRS 5. This version of the NFIRS is an all-incident based reporting system which better and more accurately describes the types of incidents to which fire departments respond. NFIRS 5 enables fire departments to accurately report how fires start. The system includes an optional arson module, which can be used with law enforcement reports to better identify intentionally set fires. NFIRS 5 includes optional modules that enable fire departments to document their response to EMS, hazardous materials, and wildland fire incidents. Optional modules are included which allow documentation of all apparatus and personnel that respond to incidents. The Division encourages fire departments to take full advantage of NFIRS 5 and to complete all appropriate modules depending on the incident.

Unfortunately many victims of fire suffer because of someone else's careless attitude toward fire. This report identifies and analyzes the causes of fire in our state. Its purpose is to raise the awareness of our citizens and elected officials to the dangers of fire. The statistics used in this report come from the fire departments in New Jersey that participate in the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS).

REPORT CONTENTS

The data presented in this report is representative of the incident data that has been submitted to the Division of Fire Safety's NFIRS Unit. Data received has been processed into the State and Federal databases. Please see pages **64** through **82** to see if your fire department has contributed to the information in this report.

In New Jersey, fire departments throughout the state responded to 339,092 incidents in 2004. The number of responses climbed to 362,490 in 2005, prompting a need for additional equipment, manpower, and other resources.

Data submission is broken down as follows:

2004 Of the **748** fire departments in the state, **656 (87%, a 10% increase from 2003)** submitted data.

Note: **45** fire departments submitted less than six months of data.

2005 Of the **746** fire departments in the state, **675 (90%, a 13% increase from 2003)** submitted data.

Note: **42** fire departments submitted less than six months of data.


The number of fire departments in the state differs from 2004 to 2005 due to the merging of two departments in Camden County (Bellmawr and Bellmawr Park) and two departments in Gloucester County (East Greenwich and Mt. Royal), the addition of Green Pond Fire Department in Morris County, and the U.S. Coast Guard Fire Department no longer submitting data to the Division of Fire Safety.

Data in this report does not include military installation fire department data. Military installation fire departments report directly to the Department of Defense.




FIRE DEPARTMENT RESPONSES

The following charts represent the number of incidents that fire departments responded to in 2004 and 2005.



INCIDENT TYPES

Incident types, which are entered and reported to the Division of Fire Safety's NFIRS Unit, include structure fires, vehicle fires, trash fires, hazardous materials fires, false alarms, and various special emergencies. Incidents involving vehicle fires have declined 1% from 2004 to 2005 and structure fire incidents have dropped about 6%. Vegetation fires and confined fires have increased approximately 3% to 5% from 2004 to 2005.











**Incident Type Responses by Category
Bergen County**



Burlington County



Camden County






Incident Type Responses by Category Cape May County




Incident Type Responses by Category Cumberland County



Essex County




Incident Type Responses by Category
Gloucester County






Incident Type Responses by Category Hudson County




Incident Type Responses by Category Hunterdon County



Mercer County**



Middlesex County**





Morris County






Incident Type Responses by Category Ocean County




Incident Type Responses by Category Passaic County



Salem County







Incident Type Responses by Category Union County









Fires by Type 2004









Factors Contributing to Ignition




Fire Suppression Factors 2004

PROPERTY LOSSES

Property losses, which are entered and reported to the Division of Fire Safety, are estimates received from fire departments throughout New Jersey. These estimates reflect the efforts of firefighters in preserving life and property with the best interest of all concerned. The losses show an increase from \$21,632,679 in 2004 to \$37,764,408 in 2005 or approximately a 16 million dollar increase. Many factors can be attributed to this increase, one of which is the rising cost of housing.





2004**





RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE FIRES


Fires in 1 & 2 family residential structures have always been a major concern of the fire service. They account for approximately 68% of all fires in New Jersey. Multifamily dwelling structures show the next highest incident rate in New Jersey, 27% in 2005. Together 95% of all fires in New Jersey can be shown to involve residential structures.

2004 and 2005**







Fires in Residential Property Uses 2004








Heat Sources of Residential Fires (By Heat Source Category)




Most Frequent Heat Sources of Residential Building Fires






Heat Sources (By Category) of Fires in 1 or 2 Family Dwellings




Heat Sources (By Category) of Fires in Multifamily Dwellings






Most Frequent Heat Sources of 1 or 2 Family Dwelling Fires




Most Frequent Heat Sources of Multifamily Dwelling Fires






Heat Sources of 1 or 2 Family Residential Building Fires 2004



HEAT SOURCES OF RESIDENTIAL FIRES



Heat Sources of 1 or 2 Family Residential Building Fires 2005






Heat Sources of Building Fires







AREAS OF FIRE ORIGIN IN RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES

New Jersey follows the pattern reported by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) in the NFPA survey, where the highest percentage of residential fires occurs in the "Cooking Area, Kitchen". NFPA reported approximately 25% of residential fires occur in the kitchen or cooking area. New Jersey had reported 47% in 2004 and 41% in 2005 cooking area or kitchen fires.






Ten Most Frequent Areas of Fire Origin in Residential Properties 2005










IGNITION CAUSES

Cause of Ignition





VEHICLE FIRES






HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RELEASES




**Type of Environment
Contaminated by Hazardous Materials Releases**






Most Frequent Container Types Involved in Hazard Materials Releases



Most Frequent Mobile Properties Involved in Hazardous Materials Incidents







WILDLAND FIRES



Acres Burned






Total Acres Burned














Detector Presence by County 2004




Detector Presence by County 2005




Detector Failure Reasons





CIVILIAN FIRE FATALITIES


Civilian fire fatalities in New Jersey have shown a downward trend since 1986 with some spikes present in 1991, 1997 and this past year of 2005. In 2005 our highest number of civilian fire fatalities were in the age range of 40 to 49, which is in line with NFPA national statistics of adults being injured or killed due to fire.





Fire Fatalities 2004





in Residential Properties**




**Civilian Fire Fatalities & Detector Performance
in Residential Properties**



















FIREFIGHTER INJURIES AND FATALITIES

Severity of Firefighter Injuries









Cause of Fire Service Casualties



Firefighter Injuries Most Frequent Activity When Injury Occurs




Firefighter Injuries Most Frequent Incident Types








Time of Day Firefighter Injuries Occurred 2004


