#### CAPITAL MARKETS

## <u>APPROVAL OF AN AMENDED SERIES RESOLUTION FOR SINGLE FAMILY – ITEM 6A.</u> This item was pulled from the Agenda.

Margaret Guarino and Ellen Duffy from Bank of America provided the Board with an update of the current financial markets. Ms. Guarino stated that there are two problems - the credit crisis and the lack of buyers in the market-the biggest of which is the credit crisis. She stated that there are between 5-6 bond deals in the market today testing the waters. Maine Housing was in the market yesterday and received a 6.25% rate for a 15-year term. New York State and Connecticut may mail their PO today. The Agency may mail tomorrow.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

Executive Director Marge Della Vecchia provided the Board with status of the Grogan Marine View rent increase issue. The project sponsor owner requested a 33% rent increase. After review of the application and the overall financial condition of the project the Agency approved a 3.5% increase. The Board affirmed the Agency staff's approval of the 3.5% rental increase and authorized the Agency's Executive Director to refer the matter to the Office of Administrative Law for a hearing of a contested case. The AOL judge issued an Initial Decision. The Agency Board approved a Final Decision and Order that rejected in part the Initial Decision. The project sponsor filed an appeal with the Appellate Division of New Jersey Superior Court. The Appellate Division issued an opinion dated October 10, 2008 affirming the Agency's Final decision in its entirety.

Ms Della Vecchia recognized Agency staff member Abram Hillson as the recipient of HUD's "Effective Project Manager" award for his work with the Homelessness Management Information System. Mr. Hillson was the sole recipient of the national award nationally.

Ms. Della Vecchia advised the Board that the Agency's solar system has been up and running since September 3rd. The total cost was \$1.2 million less a \$325,000 BPU rebate. It is estimated that the solar system will provide energy to cover 30% of the Agency's operations and that approximately \$54,000 in credits will be generated annually. The credits will be sold and act as a source of income to the Agency. The payback will be between 11-12 years.

Ms Della Vecchia announced the retirement of Property Management Director, Tony Cupano effective October 31st. Robert Sasso, who currently works in the Property Management Division will replace Mr. Cupano as the Director. There will be a reorganization of the Division of which details will be presented to the Board at the November meeting.

Board member Thomas Hunt complemented Executive Director Della Vecchia and staff Pam McCrory for the high amount of leveraging with regard to the Special Needs Housing Trust Fund projects. He stated that identifying other sources of funding in this current financial market is difficult.
