

Capital Arts-Historic Locations Awarded Projects



The New Jersey Historic Trust was created in 1967 to preserve New Jersey's historic resources across the state. The Trust is a government and non-profit agency whose mission is to advance historic preservation in New Jersey through historic preservation sensitive state policies, funding programs, and education initiatives.

The Capital Arts-Historic Locations Grant Program is presented through a partnership between the New Jersey State Council on the Arts and the New Jersey Historic Trust to support capital projects for nonprofit arts organizations located in New Jersey. The program is designed to support organizations operating within buildings that are listed or eligible for listing in the New Jersey and/or National Register of Historic Places. Funds will be used for construction expenses related to preservation, restoration, repair, and expansion to improve or enhance facilities. Grant funding is provided by the New Jersey State Council on the Arts and reviewed and administered by the New Jersey Historic Trust. For FY23 there were 13 grants awarded totaling approximately \$2.7 million, with a maximum award of \$250,000 per grantee.

The following are projects funded by the Capital Arts-Historic Locations Grant Program.




ARB Princeton (Cranbury HD)

The American Repertory Ballet Company was awarded \$47,138 for new flooring at dance studios.



Bell Labs

The Axelrod Performing Arts Center was awarded \$250,000 to convert a lecture hall into a performance theater.



Ballantine Mansion, Newark Museum (James Street Commons HD)

The Newark Museum Association was awarded \$250,000 to upgrade the indoor air quality and HVAC system.



Community Theatre (Morristown HD)

The South Street Theatre/The Community Theatre was awarded \$250,000 for the replacement of the roof and HVAC.



Fellowship Hall (First Dutch Reformed Church)

\$250,000 for electrical and fire sprinkler upgrades, replacement of flooring, environmental remediation, interior restoration, and structural modifications to support lighting and sound systems.

Hunterdon Art Museum (Dunham's/Parry's Mill)

Old Neptune High School (Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association Historic District)

The Ocean Grove Historic Preservation Society/Jersey Shore
Arts Center was
awarded \$175,000
for a roof replacement.



Montclair Art Museum

The Montclair Art Museum was awarded \$248,488 to upgrade the lighting system and soundproofing materials, install equipment for livestreaming events, and upgrade wood paneling.





The Growing Stage/ The Children's Theatre of NJ was awarded \$218,417 to upgrade lighting equipment.



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Perkins House



The Perkins Center for the Arts was awarded \$250,000 for a roof replacement, exterior painting work, and installation of HVAC.
