Completed Independent Living Assessments of Youth Ages 14-18 years






IAIU Caseload Report Statewide







² The terms "out-of-home" and "in-home" may not be appropriate for all 18-21 year olds. Youth identified as "in-home" can either be residing with a parent/relative, or living independently. Any of these youth may be receiving services. These definitions are currently being reviewed to better understand how we capture DCFs work with his population. The goal of this ongoing work is to create three meaningful categories for 18-21 year olds 1) Youth in a formal out-of-home placement setting. 2) Youth that achieved permanency, and 3) Youth that never achieved permanency.









