<b>Description of Incident</b> : During the week of 04/07/2021, C.D. was in the care of his mother's, K.T., boyfriend, R.R On 10/20/21, C.D. had difficulty breathing, he was vomiting, pale, lethargic, and had been whimpering all day. During the morning hours of 10/21/21, R.R, found C.D. unresponsive on the floor. EMS and the police responded to R.R.'s home. Upon arrival, the first responders noted that C.D.'s skin was mottled, his blood had pooled to his lower extremities and rigor mortis had set into his jaw. C.D. was transported to Saint Joseph's Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. The autopsy revealed that C.D. suffered from numerous internal injuries: rib fractures, brain swelling, laceration of the liver, subscapular hemorrhage, torn mesentery, and abdominal bleeding. According to the medical examiner, the cause of death was blunt impacts of the abdomen and head. The manner of death was ruled a homicide. R.R., was arrested and charged with 1st degree murder and 2nd degree endangering the welfare of a child. <b>Description of Incident</b> : On 05/03/21, J.B.D. Jr. and his three older siblings ages 14, 12 and 9 were traveling with their mother, M.B. (mother) and J.B.D. Sr. (father). The family was traveling on a highway when J.B.D. Sr. struck a guardrail and J.B.D. Jr. was ejected from the vehicle. J.B.D. Jr. sustained major head injuries, and he was transported to Cooper Medical Center where he was pronounced deceased. The medical examination and autopsy results revealed that J.B.D. Jr. had no injuries that were consistent with being placed in a child restraint. The Medical Examiner concluded that J.B.D. Jr. was an unrestrained rear seat passenger in a vehicle when it struck a guardrail and J.B.D. Jr. was ejected through a rear window. According to the medical examiner, the cause of death was head injuries. DCP&P conducted an investigation and J.B.D. Sr. and M.B. were substantiated for neglect.

Description of Incident: On 11/07/2020, 911 received a call reporting concerns for K.C. Upon arrival EMS found K.C. home alone. K.C.'s belly was distended, he was not breathing, and he was in cardiac arrest. K.C. was transported to St. Joseph's Hospital where he died as a result of his injuries. Upon examination, K.C. was found to have significant rectal lacerations, significant bruising on his abdomen and forehead and a distended belly. According to the medical examiner, the cause of death was blunt force injuries of the abdomen. Passaic County Prosecutor's Office investigation, revealed that K.C. was left in the care of his mother's, Q.C., paramour, J.D. The paramour had been caring for Q.C.'s three children, ages 8, 7, and 1 when he sexually and physically abused K.C. J.D. was charged with1st degree felony murder, 1st degree aggravated sexual assault and 2nd degree child endangerment. CP&P conducted an investigation and J.D. was substantiated for physical and sexual abuse.  Other Possible Child Victims and Living Arrangement (Gender/age of siblings or other children residing with the child victim or perpetrator only):H.B., 8-year-old female and J.B., 7-year-old male, were being cared for by J.D. at the time of the incident but were unharmed. Description of Incident: On 4/02/2021, C.M. had been complaining of leg pain, and he was vomiting and sleeping all day. C.M. was transported to Southern Ocean County Hospital by his father, C.G., where he died as a result of his injuries. Upon the Medical Examiner's examination, C.M. suffered from blunt force injuries with cardiac and liver contusions. The injuries were confirmed by a medical consultant, and the certified cause of death was blunt impact injuries of the chest and abdomen with laceration of the heart, left pulmonary contusion, laceration and contusion of the liver. C.G. was charged with 1st degree murder. CP&P conducted an investigation and C.G. was substantiated for physical abuse. CP&P involvement included cross allegations of abuse and neglect regarding all the caregivers for C.M.

On 9/03/2019 a concern was received that C.M. was physically abused by his father. It was reported that he returned from a visit with a bloody nose and a busted lip. The father and other relatives reported that C.M. was playing football and the ball struck C.M. in the face. C.M. did not make a disclosure to CPP or law enforcement as to how he sustained the injuries. The allegation of physical abuse against the father was Unfounded.

On 11/25/2019 a concern was received that C.M. was physically abused by his mother. C.M. had several bruises on the outer side of his thigh. The Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office was notified and conducted a forensic interview of C.M., and the child did not disclose any abuse. CPP recommended that C.M. be evaluated by the Child Protection Center (CPC) and the father declined. The allegation of physical abuse against the mother was Unfounded, and the case was open to provide supportive services to the family.

On 12/19/2019 a concern was received that C.M. was physically abused by his maternal grandmother. He had two dime sized bruises on the side of his thigh. CPP recommended that C.M. be evaluated by the Child Protection Center (CPC) and the father declined. The allegation of physical abuse against the grandmother was Unfounded and the case remained open to provide supportive services to the family.

On 01/06/2020 a concern was received that C.M. was physically abused by his maternal grandmother. He had multiple dime sized bruises on his upper thigh. There were no clear disclosures of how C.M. sustained the bruises. The Middlesex County Prosecutor's Office was notified of the allegation. The Prosecutor's Office declined to initiate an investigation since they had previously investigated similar allegations a few months ago. CPP collaborated with system partners at the Regional Diagnostic Treatment Center (RDTC) for a case consultation. It was recommended that C.M. be medically evaluated at Audrey Hepburn Children's Hospital (AHCH). CPP completed a referral for C.M. During this investigation, family court granted the father physical and residential custody of C.M. The allegation of physical abuse against the grandmother was Unfounded.

On 02/05/2020 concerns were received that the father was abusing drugs and that he was stalking and harassing the mother and maternal grandmother. C.M. was evaluated by Audrey Hepburn Children's Hospital (AHCH) for evaluations and there were no findings of abuse. The evaluator could not make a determination that the marks/bruises were a result of physical abuse. The evaluation recommended that C.M. receive a psychological evaluation to assess for emotional trauma. C.M. was linked to supportive services through Children's System of Care (CSOC). During the investigation, the father was incarcerated for charges unrelated to C.M. and family court awarded the maternal grandmother temporary custody of C.M. The allegation of neglect against the father was Unfounded.

On 04/05/2020, a concern was received that C.M. was being physically abused by his father. He had bruises by his right kidney. C.M., the father and paternal relatives were interviewed separately, and they all reported that C.M. fell on the handlebars of his bicycle causing bruising to his abdomen. An additional call was received 10 days later that C.M.'s left eye was bruised and swollen. C.M. was interviewed within 24 hours of the notification, and he was observed with a scratch on his face. C.M. reported that he was scratched by a dog. During this investigation, family court granted the father physical and residential custody of C.M. again. C.M. continued to receive therapeutic services within the community. The allegation of physical abuse against the father was Unfounded.

On 05/31/20, a concern was received that C.M. was slapped in the face by his father and C.M. was not being properly supervised when swimming. C.M. had recently dove into a pool and hit his head. It

was reported that C.M. had a bump on his hairline and a scratch behind his ear. C.M. was interviewed within 24 hours and he denied being hit by his father. C.M. was not observed to have any marks, or bruises on his face or near his hairline. The allegation of physical abuse against the father was Unfounded.

On 08/09/2020, a concern was received that C.M. was physically abused by his maternal grandmother. C.M. had 4-inch red marks on his lower back that looked like fingers and scratches. The allegation of physical abuse against the maternal grandmother was Unfounded. CPP could not conclude that the injuries were caused by the maternal grandmother as there were several variations of explanations given by C.M. as well as both sides of the family. Furthermore, some of the injuries appeared to be healing and it did not appear to have been caused during the maternal grandmother's visit.

On 12/12/20, a concern was received that C.M. was physically abused by his father. C.M. had a lump on his head and two blood spots in his eye. C.M. and the father both reported that C.M. sustained the injuries by being hit by a tree branch while on a hike. C.M. was medically evaluated by his pediatrician and subsequently by the hospital with no noted concerns of abuse. The pediatrician's office concluded that the injuries were consistent with the father and C.M.'s explanation. The allegation of physical abuse against the father was Unfounded.

On 03/26/2021, a concern was received that the father utilized inappropriate discipline to punish C.M. The father had placed C.M. on a treadmill on a very fast setting which caused him to fall, and he sustained injuries to his forehead, chest, hip, eye, arms and legs. There was also a concern that C.M. was slapped in the face. The Ocean County Prosecutor's Office was notified and interviewed C.M. who denied being physically abused by his father. Both the father and C.M. reported that the injuries occurred by C.M. falling off the treadmill and while playing football. The school nurse was interviewed and noted examining C.M. on 3/15/21 and 3/21/21 and confirmed that C.M. reported sustaining these injuries while playing football and had no concerns of abuse. The Division reviewed the video of the treadmill incident and observed C.M. running and falling on the treadmill. The father was observed to pick C.M. back up and C.M. fell multiple times before getting off the treadmill on his own. The father also appeared to bite C.M.'s head in the video. C.M. was referred to the Child Protection Center (CPC) for a medical evaluation and CPP requested the child be evaluated by a child abuse expert but the father refused.

On 4/1/21, the mother filed an emergent motion for custody but was denied. The father was ordered to make the child available for the CPC evaluation within 7 days. CPP obtained an appointment for 4/2/21 but the father stated he was unable to get off work and stated he would take the child next week. The mother took the child to the pediatrician during her parenting time on the same date who recommended the child be taken to the hospital. Bloodwork and a skeletal survey were conducted which revealed negative findings and the child was released to his mother after midnight on 4/2/21. C.M. returned to the care of his father around 9am and was reported to have appeared healthy. Later that evening, CPP received a report with concerns that C.M. was vomiting, not walking and had been taken to the hospital by his father.

On 4/2/21 CPP received a referral reporting C.M.'s death which was considered suspicious and was being investigated by law enforcement.

Medical examiner determined the cause of death to be "blunt force injuries with cardiac and liver contusions with acute inflammation and sepsis". The Division conducted an independent record review from Dr. McCans from Penn State Health and the Ocean Prosecutor's office conferred with medical

expert Dr. Andrew. Both professionals concluded that C.M. sustained injuries consistent with chronic physical abuse over a period of time. On 3/9/22, the father C.G. was charged with first degree murder for the death of his son C.M. The Division's investigation concluded Substantiated findings of physical abuse against the father for the treadmill incident as well as the child's death.

**Description of Incident**: On 08/13/2021, L.S. was transported to Morristown Medical Center by his mother, K.S. Upon arrival, L.S. was noted to be stiff and cold to the touch and he was unable to be resuscitated. Upon examination, there was significant bruising observed on L.S. body that appeared to be old and new injuries. The autopsy report revealed new and old rib fractures, new blunt force trauma of the head, multiple facial bruises, subarachnoid hemorrhage, brain swelling and optic nerve sheath hemorrhage. The report also revealed multiple bruises on his trunk, upper and lower extremities, and blunt trauma to the abdomen with hemorrhaging of the small and large intestine. According to the medical examiner, the cause of death was multiple blunt force injuries. Morris County Prosecutor's Office investigation, revealed that L.S. was left in the care of his mother's paramour, E.U. The paramour had been caring for L.S. and his 5-year-old sister, L.S. while their mother was at work. E.U. notified K.S. that something was wrong with L.S. and the mother returned home. K.S. did not seek immediate medical attention for L.S., she waited for approximately 2 ½ hours before she transported L.S. to the hospital. E.U. was charged and convicted of 1st degree murder, 2nd degree endangering the welfare of a child, 3rd degree tampering with a witness and 4th degree tampering with evidence. K.S. was charged and convicted of 2nd degree endangering the welfare of a child, 3rd degree hindering apprehension, 3rd degree tampering with a witness and 4th degree tampering with evidence. CP&P conducted an investigation and E.U. was substantiated for physical abuse and K.S was substantiated for neglect
