ALLEGATIONS	FINDINGS	RESULTS
1. Inadequate staff/child ratios: Adequate staff/child ratios are not maintained at the center.	1. At the time of the investigation, adequate staff/child ratios were not maintained in all classrooms throughout the center. In room 6, there were thirteen children ages 18 months to 2 ½ years old with two staff and a third staff was needed. Interviews with the director and staff and a review of documentation, including staff and children's attendance records revealed that adequate staff/child ratios were maintained on 1/18/2018 in all classrooms. The center needs to ensure that adequate staff/child ratios are maintained at all times.	<u>1. Substantiated</u>
2. Lack of supervision: The center does not ensure adequate supervision at all times. A two year old child scratched a named child on the forehead and sustained scratches previously at the center.	2. At the time of the investigation, adequate supervision was maintained throughout the center. Interviews with the director and staff and a review of documentation indicated that the staff did observe the incident, wherein the named child was scratched by another child after the named child tried to take a bike from that child, but was unable to intervene in time to prevent the injury. Staff stated that they addressed the incident tending to the children immediately and notified the parents as required. A review of documentation revealed that all staff were trained on the center's supervision policy and implement this policy in their classroom at all times. Although this incident did occur, it does not appear to be due to inadequate supervision. As a result of observation and interview this allegation could not be substantiated.	<u>2. Unsubstantiated</u>

<p>3. Inadequate procedures for incidents: The center is not maintaining adequate procedures for incidents. The same named child had a scratch on her forehead and the parents were not notified immediately of the head injury.</p>	<p>3. Interviews with the director and staff and a review of documentation revealed that adequate procedures for incidents occurring at the center were adhered to when the named child was injured, including completion of an accident report and notification to the parent in a timely manner. However, a further review of the center's accident/incident log revealed that not all documentation and reporting was complete as required. The center needs to ensure that adequate procedures for incidents occurring at the center are adhered to at all times, including complete documentation of incident/accident reports.</p>	<p>3. Substantiated</p>
