ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY PROGRAM

The Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) is a statewide program that provides a legal substitute address to victims and survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking, as well as reproductive health patients and providers to use in place of a physical address to reduce the risk of harm.

QUALIFICATIONS



Experienced domestic violence, sexual violence, or stalking and reported this to law enforcement or the courts; or



Be a reproductive health patient, employee, providers or volunteer; and



Must be in ongoing fear of harm or experienced threats of harm; and



Relocation is necessary for all participants to protect address.

ACP is unable to remove addresses that are already publicly recorded but can protect future exposure.

OUR SERVICES

MAIL SERVICES

ACP staff provides participants with an enrollment card. Participants present this card to public agencies when asked for their physical location. By law, public agencies use this substitute address for all administrative purposes.

ACP forwards participants' mail to their actual or preferred mailing address. Participants may use the substitute address for their work or school address, on driver's licenses, or when filing for public benefits.

DIRECT ADVOCACY

ACP provides direct assistance to participants enrolled in the program. It assists participants with program onboarding, re-certification, system barriers and referrals to victim services and community resources.

TRAINING & SYSTEMS OUTREACH

ACP relies on the assistance of victim service agencies and other agencies to enroll participants in the program. ACP trains advocates, government agencies, victim services, community organizations and private entities. It develops coordinated approaches to improve systems that affect ACP participants.
