QUESTIONS

- **Q1.** The RFP indicates there's a total amount of \$313,894 for a nine-month term. Is the \$313,894 pro-rated for nine months, or are additional funds anticipated in additional fiscal years?
- **A.** The total award is \$313,894 per FSC for the nine-month term and will remain the ongoing contract amount in future fiscal year. No additional funds are anticipated.

- Q2. Can funds be used for vehicle maintenance, fuel, and insurance costs?
- **A**. For agency purchased vehicles, yes; funds may be budgeted for maintenance, fuel, tools, and insurance. For personal vehicles used for program services, no; only mileage reimbursement may be budgeted.
- **Q3.** Are more than three letters of support and letters of collaboration allowable?
- **A.** Applicants may submit no more than five letters of support and/or collaboration.
- **Q4.** Our agency currently has several FSCs located throughout the state. The staffing model we have been following is one Site Supervisor, one Family Partner and one Volunteer Coordinator. We also have a Program Director who oversees all of the FSCs along with working on other State/County contracts. The Site Supervisor, Family Partner and Volunteer Coordinator are 100% dedicated to their FSC.

Based on the RFP, we are confused if the model we are following is correct now. If we apply for more than one site for this RFP, are we fine with having just one Site Supervisor and continuing to have a Program Director oversee these new sites in addition to working on other non-FSC contracts?

A. Yes. For managing agencies that oversee multiple FSC's, it is allowable to have one Site Supervisor and a shared Program Director who provides oversight across sites. However, while the described staffing pattern is generally consistent with FSC operations, applicants must use the official program titles outlined in the NJ FSC Operations Manual when completing contract documents.
