The Office for Coastal Management (OCM) has completed its review of New Jersey's Coastal Management Program's Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-2020 Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) Section 309 Final Assessment and Strategy. We initially received a draft to review on May 1, 2015, and received final revisions on September 18, 2015. OCM is pleased to inform you that we approve New Jersey's 2016-2020 Assessment and Strategy. OCM also concurs with the State's designated priority rankings for the nine enhancement areas.

With an approved Assessment and Strategy, the New Jersey Coastal Management Program is eligible for FY 2016-2020 weighted formula (or base) funds under Section 309 of the CZMA to implement the work plans as presented in New Jersey's strategy. For FY 2016, both the hazards and ocean and Great Lakes resources (focusing on comprehensive planning) enhancement areas are designated as enhancement areas of national importance. Therefore you are also eligible to apply for competitive Projects of Special Merit funding to further your *Resilient and Sustainable Coastal Communities* and *Completing and Implementing a Mid-Atlantic Region Ocean Plan* strategies that support these enhancement areas of national importance.
