<i>Ilex verticillata</i>	Winterberry holly, deciduous holly
<i>Lindera benzoin</i>	Spicebush, snapwood, wild allspice
<i>Aronia arbutifolia</i>	Red chokeberry
<i>Amelanchier Canadensis</i>	Serviceberry, shadbush, shadblow
<i>Rosa Carolina</i>	Pasture rose
<i>Sambucus Canadensis</i>	Common elder, elder-berry
<i>Staphylea trifoliata</i>	Bladdernut
<i>Ptelea trifoliata</i> (state endangered)	Three-leaved hoptree, wafer-ash
<i>Rhus copallinum</i>	Winged sumac, dwarf sumac
<i>Toxicodendron radicans</i>	Poison ivy, Cow itch
<i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i>	Highbush blueberry
<i>Rosa palustris</i>	Swamp rose
