REVIEW ZONE ACTIONS

Mr. Amon and Mr. Carr presented the Commissioners with the following projects for their review and approval:

Blue Spring Mews

Mr. Jessen then moved for approval of the above projects. Project 84-0238 (C.S. Johnson Company) will have a condition that a landscape plan must be submitted for the detention basin. Mr. Hamilton then seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

J.L. WILLIAMS PROJECT

Mr. Carr told the Commissioners that we are still facing policy problems with projects that were approved before the Commission's regulations became effective but were not built. He pointed out that it is the Commission's policy to waive review for any project approved before the effect of the Review Zone Regulations but many such projects needed to get new approvals because of minor changes in plans. The J.L. Williams project in Franklin Township exemplifies this issue. Mr. Amon said that his attitude was to require review and compliance if any new approval is necessary but he would like guidance from the Commission. The Commission generally agreed with Mr. Amon's position but felt that each project must be examined on its own. Mr. Carr was asked to get detailed information on the J.L. Williams project.

STATUS OF FUNDING AND EXPENDITURES

Mr. Kraml informed the Commissioners of the status of expenditures and distributed a Capital Project Status report for April 1984. (Copy attached) The topics that were discussed were the historic and recreational plan; recreational nodes, pedestrian bridges, and the multi-purpose trail development and acquisition (rails to trails grant). Mr. Amon felt that it would be appropriate for him to discuss with Parks staff a priority list for the approximately \$350,000 remaining for capital improvement and then resume the subject at the next Commission meeting. Mrs. Nash requested a map detailing where and on what the money has been spend. The pedestrian bridges were then discussed and following Mr. Jessen's motion to approve the bridges as presented the motion carried unanimously following Mr. Torpey's second.

LAND ACQUISITION

Mr. Holland stated that a gas station that faces the canal between Warren and Broad Streets in Trenton is now available for purchase. Its acquisition would create a continuous park from the Battle Monument to the canal. Mr. Holland moved that the Canal Commission recommend to Parks the acquisition of this site. Mr. Jessen seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

CANAL COMMISSION BUDGET

Mr. Kirkland said that several legislators have been contacted regarding the Commission's need to have additional funds for the FY 1985 budget. Assemblyman Weidel has started the process to get the additional funds but Mr. Kirkland urged the members of the Commission to continue contacting their legislators.

Mr. Torpey informed the Commissioners of the status of the celebratory events.

Mansion Hill Project

Mr. Mizur informed the Commissioners of his problems with regard to his proposed Mansion Hill project. He is experiencing difficulty with the N.J.W.S.A. in regards to the pipe that goes under the canal. Also the Ewing Township Planning Board has required that Mr. Mizur widen the road by 6 feet. The following negative points were brought up regarding the widening of the road:

- . The road would come very near the house which faces the canal, a house which clearly contributes to the D & R Canal National Registration as a historic place. To bring the road this close would severely denigrate the value of the house.
- . Increasing the width would increase runoff and pollution entering the canal.

- . Increasing the width would require removal of mature trees which contribute to the character of the Wilburtha Road community. This community is eligible for inclusion on the National Register as a historic district and therefore it makes an important positive contribution to the character of the Canal Park.
- . We have no intention of widening the canal bridge. Therefore widening the road will merely contribute to increasing the speed at which cars approach the canal bridge.

Following this dicussion Mr. Hamilton moved that the Commission request that the widening of Wilburtha Road not take place. Following Mr. Torpey's second the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Torpey then moved that the May meeting of the Commission be held at Prallsville Mill in Stockton. This motion was seconded by Mr. Jones and unanimously carried.

Over the course of the past month the following projects have been accomplished:

- 1. Continued to brush back the railroad right-of-way from Smiths Mill to about the Devils Tea Table. Efforts were halted in this indeavor by the malfunction of our tractor and dump truck.
- 2. Poured all but two of the replacement mile markers.
- 3. Constructed new doors for the Bull's Island office.
- 4. Replaced grills and picnic tables at Bull's Island.
- 5. Removed numerous trees that blew down and blocked the tow path during the recent bad weather.


In the month to come we will be involved in the following:

- 1. Finish pouring and begin installation of the replacement mile markers.
- 2. Installing flood lights at the Belle Mead office parking lot.
- York raking our parking lots, roadways, and tow path.
- 4. Setting up the Blackwell's Mills and Griggstown day use areas.
- 5. Repairing sites and roadways at Bull's Island, fill and grade.
- Repairing water damaged equipment at Bull's Island.
- 7. Installing a bulletin board at Bull's Island.
- 8. Opening the Lambertville wash house, the campground dump station and the northern comfort station in the campground.
- 9. Begin our annual and continuous grass mowing operations.


CAPITAL PROJECT STATUS APRIL 1984

Trail Study Trenton to Lambertville and design trail from Scudders Falls to Lower Ferry Road.

Project halted due to cancellation of Federal grant. Spent to date approximatel \$10,500. When additional funds are budgeted project can continue.


