## **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Hahn reported on the staff's monthly work tally, and described a pre-application meeting involving the widening of the New Jersey Turnpike between interchanges 6 and 9.

Mr. Jessen joined the meeting at 10:10 AM.

Mr. Hahn said that on Monday, both the Senate and Assembly Environment Committees released a bill that would allow the Commission to charge fees and approve selected projects administratively.

# D&R CANAL STATE PARK REPORT

Ms. Chirco, Canal Park Historian, reported that Susan Herron retired last month as Superintendent of the Canal Park and that Patricia Kallesser is now acting Superintendent. She said the maintenance staff is busy clearing brush and fallen trees from the last storm/flood. She said a restoration company is looking at three Canal Park buildings in Griggstown for power washing and mold abatement. She said the Canal Park will be employing Trenton youth between June and August to help with path maintenance.

## WATER SUPPLY AUTHORITY REPORT

Mr. Bogosian said the Authority is doing storm damage repair from South Bound Brook to the Landing Lane spillway. He said they are repairing a washout at the Kingston lock (also a result of the storm), and conducting repairs at Scudder's Falls. He said they are beginning work at the Station 26 spillway.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Mr. Hahn said the staff had finished the draft regulations and was now working on their justification. He said he will present a draft fee schedule for the Commission's review in the event that the legislative bill to charge fees is approved. Ms. Mitchell moved approval to proceed with the process of adopting the draft regulations as proposed; Mr. Albert seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Jessen moved approval to enter into Executive Session to discuss matters involving litigation. Mr. Knights seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. The Commission entered Executive Session at 10:25 AM.

The public meeting resumed and adjourned at 10:35 AM.
