

# Welcome to Hunting in the Garden State!

New Jersey offers sportsmen and sportswomen incredible opportunities to participate in their favorite outdoor activity. For hunters, this means more than a hundred days of deer hunting, including seasons for bow, shotgun and muzzleloading rifle, and some of the best small game, upland bird and waterfowl hunting on the east coast! For those looking for a place to hunt, New Jersey has hundreds of thousands of acres of public lands open to hunting. This includes more than 358,000 acres in 122 wildlife management areas statewide specifically managed to conserve and enhance wildlife populations and provide for wildlife-oriented recreation.

Getting started hunting in New Jersey has never been easier and the Division of Fish and Wildlife has made significant changes in many of our programs to help you get out in the field. These changes include an updated Hunter Education program that now includes a free online course; an improved electronic license sales system providing more options and easier use; an Apprentice License that provides the opportunity to actively participate by hunting with a licensed hunter before you take the required

hunter education course, and programs, workshops and mentoring opportunities through the Recruitment, Retention and Reactivation (R3) program.

Never hunted before? Here's how to start.

## **Complete a Hunter Education Course**

A hunter education course must be completed if a person has never had a hunting license or has no record of a previous license or completion of hunter education from New Jersey or another state. Visit NJFishandWildlife.com/hunted.htm to learn all about New Jersey's Hunter Education program and how to take the free online HunterCourse.com Interactive Hunter Education Course. Information about signing up for the live-fire session after successful completion of the online course is also found there. Remember to print your online course completion voucher and bring it with you to the in-person, live-fire test.

## **Purchase Your Hunting License**

After completing the Hunter Education program and receiving your certification, you will be ready to purchase a hunting license! First time hunting license purchasers can buy their license one of two simple ways:

- In-person at a license agent. A list of agents is found on pages 16–17 of this Digest and on the Fish and Wildlife website. Be sure to bring your Hunter Education Course Completion Card and driver license (if you are of age) when purchasing your license.
- 2. Online. After our Hunter Education staff enters your information electronically, you will receive an email confirmation to allow you to purchase your license from the comfort of your home.

Remember, always keep your hunting license in a safe place and take it with you whenever you go hunting. Your hunting license must be displayed on your outer clothing whenever you are afield.



## Licenses

See Hunting Licenses and Permits table on page 8 for license and permit types, fees, requirements and additional information on how to obtain.

All persons hunting or trapping must be properly licensed. It is unlawful for any person age 10 and older to hunt without a license. (See Farmer Regulations, page 70.) It is unlawful for any person age 12 or older to trap without a trapping license. Hunting licenses are valid for the calendar year and expire on Dec. 31 regardless of purchase date.

Licenses and permits can be purchased online at www.NJ.WildlifeLicense.com or in-person from a license agent. (See page 16 for a list of agent locations.) New hunters and new to N.J. hunters must go in person to a license agent unless they are certain that their hunter education/proof of prior license has already been added to their profile in the license system. For new Hunter Education students, this can take 2-3 days after successful completion of the field day.

All hunters and trappers must visibly display their license on their outer clothing (not covered by a pack or harness) and must show their license to any law enforcement officer or any person requesting to see it. Farmers hunting their own land must also display any deer season permit.

Do NOT heat laminate the durable license or permit. High temperature will destroy these waterproof, heat-sensitive documents.

### **License Purchase Requirements**

To purchase a hunting or trapping license, you must have:

- 1. A resident hunting or trapping license from any state, or a Hunter or Trapper Education Course Completion Card (for appropriate sporting arm) unless purchasing an Apprentice License. (See Apprentice License)
- 2. U.S. citizens must provide their Social Security Number. Non-citizens must provide their passport, visa, green card, or non-U.S. driver license. Driver licenses are required for everyone 18 and older when using the online license system.
- 3. A completed Child Support Certification. (New Child Support Certification must be completed annually.)
- 4. New residents and new customers should be prepared to show proof of residency. One must be a resident of NJ for six months prior to purchasing a resident license. Residents of New Jersey must provide one of the following forms of identification:
- » N.J. Driver License
- » N.J. Voter Registration Card
- » N.J. Non-driver photo ID issued by the N.J. Motor Vehicle Commission

## **How To Buy A License**

Licenses can be purchased in person at participating license agents or online. Hunters who are new to New Jersey should bring all required documents (see above) to a participating license agent where your profile will be created during the purchase process.

Prior to making your first purchase, your profile will be created and you will be assigned a nine digit Conservation ID number (CID number) as your permanent identification number. If you have completed a hunter education course in New Jersey recently, your profile has already been created and CID number generated for you. Your profile will be updated by the hunter education coordinator to reflect course completion within 2-3 days.

If you have previously completed a hunter education course in another state or are a non-resident who has not yet purchased any licenses in New Jersey, you may use this link as a guide to create your profile (NJFishandWildlife.com/cid\_creation. htm). After creating your profile, you will need to show a Hunter Education Course Completion Card or a previous resident hunting license from any state to be entered into your profile as proof of eligibility. This can be done at a license agent or by emailing your credentials to the Hunter Education office at NJHunterEd@dep.nj.gov. Please note that if your hunter education card contains PII information, check that you can email it securely.

## **Complete a Child Support Certification**

The "Child Support Program Improvement Act" requires Fish and Wildlife to collect and maintain Social Security numbers and child support obligation certification for all license applications. Certifications must be completed prior to a customer's first purchase each license year regardless of whether the purchase is made online or at a license agent. If your first purchase of the year is at a License Agent then the customer must be present to complete the Child Support Certification in person. The online child support certification allows an individual to complete the form from the privacy of their home. Once done, the certification remains valid for the calendar year in which the certification was completed. When the child support form is completed online the customer does not need to be present at the license agent for a purchase to be made on or for their behalf.

#### **Purchasing at a License Agent**

License agents can create customer profiles and add hunter education and/or prior hunting license information on profiles. If opting to make your first purchase at a license agent, please bring all documents required (listed above) with you to the store.

When licenses are purchased at a license agent customers can walk out of the store with their purchases in hand. Items are printed on durable stock and a copy of your receipt is able to be emailed to you for your records. In the event you lose any purchase that was made at a license agent you will be charged \$2 for duplicates regardless of where you make your duplicate purchase.

#### **Print Your Hunting License at Home for Immediate Use!**

ALL online purchases:

- Print from home on plain paper. (Credit card and convenience fees apply.)
- \* Are valid immediately.
- Have free unlimited home reprints.
- Allow ordering on green, durable stock for \$2.

Every purchaser of a Firearm or All-Around license will automatically be sent a durable stock license by mail at no additional cost. The PDF paper license for Firearm and All-Around licenses is a temporary license only and will not be able to be reprinted after the temporary term ends. If a Firearm or All-Around license is lost, customers must purchase a duplicate which cost \$2 each. Duplicates will also generate a new temporary PDF print-at-home license and a new durable stock, green copy will be sent in the mail.

## **Multiple Customer Transactions**

The license system allows for transactions to contain purchases for more than one customer at a time. License agents are able to do this only as long as each individual in the group is either present or has already completed their Child Support Certification online.

Online, one person must login, add items to the shopping cart for one person and then click the 'Add Profile' button to add an additional customer profile to the transaction. It is important that each customer already have a completed profile and completes their Child Support Certification PRIOR to starting this process. All purchased items can be printed on plain paper immediately upon purchase, and each individual included in the transaction will have the ability to access their items by logging into their own account.

## **Apprentice License**

The Apprentice Hunting License allows any ageappropriate U.S. citizen to try shotgun (18 years or older) or archery hunting (14 years or older) before completing a Hunter Education Course. Apprentice Hunters MUST hunt under the direct supervision and guidance of a hunting mentor, hunting together as a unit in the same location. Mentors must be 21 years of age or older and must possess a valid New Jersey Hunting License for the hunting method (bow or firearm) being used.

Apprentice hunters must adhere to hunting laws, regulations and must purchase all hunting permits, stamps or the HIP certification, as required. Apprentice Licenses are available at license agents and online.

Apprentice license holders are NOT eligible for a Rifle Permit, Coyote Permit or Muzzleloader Deer Permit and may not hunt with any type of rifle. Apprentice hunters may not hunt for coyote or fox. An air gun is not considered a rifle.

Individuals are limited to two apprentice licenses per type per lifetime. Due to New Jersey Firearm ID Card regulations, Firearm Apprentice Licenses are limited to individuals 18 years of age and older. An archery Apprentice License holder must be 14 years of age or older. Regular fees apply. There are no free youth apprentice licenses.

## **Hunter and Trapper Education** Requirements

New Jersey requires that everyone, age 10 and above, applying to hunt with a firearm or bow must show a previous resident license of the appropriate type from this or any state, or a course completion

card from the appropriate hunter education course to obtain a regular license, see *Apprentice License*, above. Anyone, age 12 and above, applying to trap furbearing animals must show a previous resident trapping license from this or any state, or a trapper education course completion card.

All hunter education students must first complete the HunterCourse.com online program (huntercourse.com/usa/newjersey/), which covers both firearm and bow, then pass the 100-question test. Print your completion voucher.

Next, students must register for a specific date/ time at one of the mandatory live-fire sessions listed on the Hunter Education Registration Site (a registration code is not required): https:// he.aspirafocus.com/huntersafety/Account/ Register?controllingSpc=38.

Students must register for each discipline (firearm or bow) separately and for different times. Do not register for two sessions in the same time slot. Students must bring their completion voucher to the live-fire session.

Trapper Education courses are offered once in the spring and four times in the months of September and October. To enroll in a trapper education course, go to the Fish and Wildlife website or call (856) 629-0552 to register.

#### **Lost Licenses**

A license, permit or stamp can be replaced at any license agent or at Fish and Wildlife's Internet license sales site, www.NJ.WildlifeLicense.com. A \$2 fee is charged for each duplicate license/permit. Items that were initially purchased online can be reprinted for free. Reprints are PDFs that will print on plain paper. Reprints can be found by logging into your profile online, then clicking the 'Reprint Licenses' button. In the case of All-Around and Firearm licenses, temporary PDFs are only able to be reprinted during their term of validation, otherwise the customer must click on 'Purchase Duplicate Licenses' button and pay the \$2 duplicate fee for a new temporary PDF to be generated and a new durable stock copy to be printed and mailed.

#### **New Jersey National Guard Licenses**

New Jersey National Guard personnel in good standing are entitled to free licenses, permits, and stamps. These privileges are available at all license agents; however, hunters and anglers should first confirm with the DMVA office to ensure they are certified in that system. The NJNG will only certify individuals for six months at a time. Call (609) 530-6866, e-mail robert.greco@dmava.nj.gov or write to: MSG (Ret.) #### **Resident Licenses**

A resident license may be purchased if one has maintained their domicile in New Jersey for at least six months prior to the purchase.

#### **Non-resident Licenses**

Non-residents must show either a resident license from their state or proof of successfully completing an appropriate hunter education course to obtain a license to hunt or trap in New Jersey. Non-immigrant aliens who temporarily import firearms to the United States must first obtain an application for the permit from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF). For importation of firearms, use form ATF Form 5330.3A. The approval may take up to 12 weeks. Contact ATF's New Jersey field office at (609) 989-2142 or download forms from their website at www.atf.gov/firearms/firearms-forms.

#### **Military Licenses, Active Duty**

Any person on active duty in the United States armed services, regardless of their current residency, may buy a New Jersey resident hunting license. Service personnel may obtain an Apprentice License (see below) or present a previous resident license (from this or any state) of the appropriate type or show proof to the license agent of successful completion of the appropriate hunter education course along with proof of your current active-duty status in the armed services.

#### **One-day License**

A one-day license may be issued for hunting on a licensed commercial shooting preserve only. This license may be obtained at the shooting preserve and is valid only on the day issued for the species covered by the preserve's license. Hunter Education requirements still apply.

## Disabled Veteran Licenses, Stamps, & Permits

# Free hunting and fishing licenses, stamps and permits are available for resident disabled veterans.

For the purposes of this program, legislation defines eligible disabled veterans as "...any resident of New Jersey who has been honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from active service from any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States and who has been declared by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs, or its successor, to have a service-connected disability of any degree..."

New applicant disabled veterans may obtain their hunting and fishing licenses and stamps by mailing their application to the address listed. Fish and Wildlife offices will no longer accept Disabled Veteran Certifications in person. For more information and updates, go to NJFishandwildlife.com/dvinfo.htm.

Applications for disabled veteran certification and your first disabled veteran license may be made via the mail by sending the application and all required documentation to:

N.J. Division of Fish and Wildlife Attn: Disabled Veteran Licensing MC 501-03, PO Box 420 Trenton, NJ 08625-0420 All licenses, stamps and permits for which the veteran is eligible will be free of charge. Disabled Veteran status does not give preferential treatment in any lottery. For questions call (609) 292-2965.

## **Disabled Veteran Applicants:**

- Documentation of current benefits for a service-connected disability and proof of honorable discharge (such as a copy of your DD-214, VA card or monthly check stub) must be presented to be certified for disabled veteran status in our license system.
- 2. Applicant must provide a hunter education (archery, firearm, shotgun or rifle) course certificate applicable to the license for which he or she is applying or a previously issued resident archery or firearm license or Rifle Permit. Resident licenses from other states issued to hunters in New Jersey will be accepted if the license indicates the sporting arm for which it was valid. Non-resident licenses from other states are not acceptable.

### **Revocation of Licenses**

Anyone convicted of a second fish and game violation, in this or any other state, within a period of five years will have their New Jersey hunting and fishing privileges revoked for a minimum of two years.

Certain violations carry greater periods of revocation, ranging from three years to lifetime revocation. Two convictions of any wildlife management area regulation will result in a five-year revocation of all sporting privileges. Two convictions of the following will result in lifetime revocation: safety zone violation, causing damage to real or personal property and negligent use of a firearm or bow. Fish and Wildlife may revoke any special use permit or other authorization granted by N.J. Division of Fish and Wildlife (excluding hunting or fishing licenses, which are revoked under statutory authority) for violation or due cause. See page 19 for New Jersey's participation in the Interstate Wildlife Violator Compact.

# **Permits for Hunters and Trappers**

## **Deer, Fall Turkey, and Coyote Permits**

Permits are required to hunt during the Permit Bow, Permit Shotgun, and Permit Muzzleloader Deer Seasons, Fall Turkey Season, and the Permit Coyote and Fox season. These permits are all sold on a first come first served basis and do not have a lottery. Permit Sales are open to all hunters who have an appropriate valid license. Permit purchases can be made at all License Agents and online. See each specific species section for detailed information on permit sales, permit availability and rules and regulations.

See Special Areas, page 43, for specific deer permit requirements on those properties. Permits can be purchased online or at any license agent.

## **Spring Turkey, Beaver, and Otter Permits**

There are lotteries for Spring Turkey, Beaver, and Otter Permits. Deadlines and Dates can be found within the information for each species. The lottery application period and processes are the same regardless of species.

## **Falconry Permits**

Hunting with raptors (birds of prey) is allowed only with both a falconry permit and a hunting license. For information see *Falconry*, page 25.

#### **Rifle Permits**

All persons in possession of a rifle (modern or muzzleloading rifle including a smoothbore muzzleloader firing a single projectile) while hunting or trapping must have a valid Rifle Permit. See the specific regulations for each game or furbearing animal for the specific rifles allowed. A Rifle Permit is not required for hunting with an air gun. Initial Rifle Permit applicants must be at least 10 years old and have successfully completed the Firearms

or (now discontinued) Rifle Hunter Education Course or have a resident license or Hunter Education card from any state that includes use of a rifle. See page 11 for Rifle Permit fees.

- Rifle Permits may be purchased at license agents or at Fish and Wildlife's Internet license sales site.
   Rifle Permits are valid for all ages of permit holders.
- Rifle Permits are valid from July 1–June 30.

# **Permits for Hunters with Disabling Conditions**

A permit to use alternative methods/equipment for taking game during the prescribed seasons for certain physically challenged persons may be issued. The application period is Jan. 1 to Aug. 31 of each year.

## **Permits to Shoot from a Standing Vehicle**

A permit to hunt or shoot on private property from a standing vehicle that is parked off the road may be issued to licensed hunters who:

- Have a permanent or irreversible physical disability that limits their ambulatory ability,
- Suffer from cardiovascular disease and are classified as Class 3 or 4 heart patients according to American Heart Association standards, or
- 3. Suffer from chronic lung disease.

This permit will be issued if the need is certified by a licensed physician or chiropractor.

Individuals hunting with a permit to hunt or shoot from a motor vehicle must mark the vehicle from which they are hunting either with handicapped license plates issued by the Motor Vehicle Commission or by displaying a notice provided by Fish and Wildlife in the rear window of this vehicle.

## **Permits, Other**

### **Deer Road-kill Permits**

Deer accidentally killed by motor vehicles may be possessed only for private consumption by obtaining a free permit from the local police department or from a Fish and Wildlife regional law enforcement office. The permit authorizes only possession of the meat and is valid only for 90 days. The possession of all other parts such as antlers, under terms of this permit, are expressly prohibited. Wrapped venison packages must be labeled with the permit number.

#### **Tracking Dog Permits, Certification**

Fish and Wildlife may issue permits to dog handlers who possess a certified tracking dog for the day-time or nighttime search and recovery of deer lost by a hunter during any legal deer hunting season. Minimum certification: UBT-1 from United Blood Trackers, Inc., or the equivalent from another recognized tracking dog organization. A photo of each certified dog must accompany the application. Each handler must possess a valid New Jersey hunting license for the current year. For more information on obtaining a permit, go to: NJFishandWildlife. com/deer\_trackingdog.htm. ## **Stamps**

Stamps (such as federal migratory bird stamps) are not transferable to another person and are not valid unless signed across the face in ink. Stamps need not be affixed to the license. State waterfowl "stamps" and Pheasant and Quail "stamps" now print either directly on your hunting license or as a separate stub, replacing the former paper stamp for these privileges.

# **Dumping Violator Paid the Price**

One of the many duties of Division of Fish and Wildlife conservation police officers is the investigation of solid waste dumping on state wildlife management areas. In December of 2020, Officer Jean Mutone investigated a large pile of construction debris off Bryant Road in Greenwood Forest WMA, Ocean County. On the underside of a kitchen countertop, she discovered the company name of the original installer. The owner of the company provided a break in the case when he located records of the old job and shared the Lanoka Harbor address with Officer Mutone.

When confronted with the evidence, the homeowner immediately took responsibility for dumping the debris from his recent kitchen remodeling project. In court, the illegal dumper was fined \$1,000 and required to pay restitution to Fish and Wildlife for all clean-up costs.

## **HUNTERS: Know Before You Go!**

Two separate fish and wildlife convictions for violating any New Jersey saltwater, freshwater, trapping or hunting law within a five-year period will cause you to lose your hunting and fishing privileges for two-to five-years! This means convictions for taking under-sized or over limit striped bass in Marine waters can prevent you from hunting!

**Wildlife management area violations** such as possession of alcohol, swimming, ATV use and illegal dumping also fall under fish and wildlife offenses and can result in license revocation.

**Don't take a chance on losing your license because you heard the wrong information!** If you have any questions regarding hunting or fishing regulations, please call your regional Fish and Wildlife Law Enforcement office before going in the field.

The overwhelming majority of New Jersey hunters, trappers and anglers are ethical, law abiding citizens with a low tolerance for those not willing to follow the laws. If you see a violation occurring, report it immediately by calling 1-(877) WARN-DEP.

## Interstate Wildlife Violator Compact

New Jersey is member of the Interstate Wildlife Violator Compact, a multi-state agreement designed to 1. enhance protection of wildlife resources in member states, 2. provide equal treatment of non-resident hunters/anglers/trappers, and 3. improve compliance with citations or summonses issued for wildlife violations.

# Responsible hunters and anglers want wildlife violators removed from the population of ethical sporting enthusiasts.

Under the Compact, information about suspension of sporting license privileges for people convicted of wildlife violations in New Jersey will be shared with participating Compact states. The other Compact member states determine if the individual would also be suspended according to their own state laws.

Similarly, New Jersey will be provided with information on individuals suspended for convictions under the law of all Compact states. When reviewed, if the violation(s) would lead to suspension under New Jersey's laws, that individual's privileges will also be suspended in New Jersey.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If an individual has a wildlife license or privilege suspension in any Compact state, it is the individual's responsibility to first contact the licensing authority in the state where they intend to hunt, fish, trap, harvest shellfish or otherwise take or possess wildlife to determine their eligibility before purchasing any license or engaging in those activities.

Under New Jersey law, two convictions of any violation of the fish and game laws of this **or any other state** within five years will result in a two-year hunting and fishing license suspension.

Individuals with wildlife violation convictions or license suspensions received outside of New Jersey may call the Compact Administrator at (609) 259-3347 to determine his or her license eligibility in New Jersey.
