

WHITE PERCH

Morone americana

Description:

- ♦ olive to silvery green above, brassy sides and white belly
- deep body (deepest under first dorsal fin)
- no dark stripes on adults
- ♦ 2 dorsal fins, barely connected; first with 8-10 strong spines
- no teeth on tongue

Size:

♦ up to 22 inches, most commonly between 7-10 inches


Range:

- Atlantic drainages from St. Lawrence River, Canada to Peedee River, South Carolina
- Lake Ontario

Facts:

- prefer brackish waters but also found in freshwater
- begin spawning run in spring as water temperatures rise, adults move upstream to freshwater
- ♦ eggs hatch in 1-6 days
- ♦ juveniles will stay near hatching grounds through summer and fall

- ♦ spend much of their lives in the same area where they hatched
- ♦ winter in deeper waters throughout the bays
- ♦ live an average of 10 years; but can live up to 17 years



*from 1980 to 1987, the largest catch was 755 fish in 1984
