Dear Party/Charter Boat Owners and Captains:

Due to the recent destruction surrounding "Superstorm" Sandy, the Division of Fish and Wildlife (Division) is attempting to develop an initial assessment of the damage to New Jersey's recreational and commercial fishing fleets and infrastructure. We are requesting this in an attempt to determine the amount of damage you incurred specifically related to your for-hire operations, including estimates of time lost on the water.

We would appreciate it if you could please take the time to answer a few questions to get us started. We are considering any loss of fishing/damage that occurred since Saturday, October 27 2012.
