Old Business:

- Direct Market Harvest Update

Jason Hearon reminded everyone that the high mortality beds and Shell Rock had been closed for a while. He continued by stating the industry had met or slightly exceeded the total quota for those beds. Mr. Hearon made a related note that the medium mortality beds had about 1,500 bushels left for harvest prior to the day of the meeting, and that the harvest season would end on Nov. 21, 2014.

- Finalized Leasing Committee Members

Mr. Hearon recapped from the previous meeting that the Leasing Committee was to be reestablished. There was discussion since the previous meeting on who the members would have been. Councilman Hollinger added that the members selected represented both traditional and aquaculture leasing. The result was that the following people were to be on the Leasing Committee: Councilman Warren Hollinger, Councilman Steve Fleetwood, Bobby Robbins, Ned Gaines, and Brian Harmen.

Councilman Fleetwood made the motion to approve the recommendation, Councilman Hollinger seconded the motion, and all were in favor to approve the Leasing Committee members. Russell Babb was to email the members dates for a short meeting in December, and Jenny Tomko of Division of Fish and Wildlife would organize the meeting and contact the members.

New Business:

- 2015 Ground Leases & ADZ's are updated, printed and ready for signatures

Mr. Hearon encouraged people to come into the office prior to the weeks of Christmas and New Year's Day if they had a ground lease or license to renew. Previously, many people wait until the last minute, and the office can become overwhelmed.

Miscellaneous

Charles Clark posed the question of why the tonging line could not be moved to its previous position. In addition, he requested water quality samples to support why the line could be moved. Councilman Hollinger responded that it takes 3 years of water quality sampling to change the lines. The Bureau of Marine Water Monitoring had gone through 3 years of sampling, and the conditions became worse. He added that the area was downgraded from Special Restricted to Prohibited only a few months previous. Further discussion ensued.

Councilman Hollinger stated that Bruce Friedman was requested to be at the next Council Meeting to answer questions and concerns.

David Bushek stated that the Dermo prevalence had increased for October 2014, following the expected trend. The prevalence average was slightly under the long term average. Mr. Bushek also invited those who were interested to hear Gary Wolf of the Department of Health talk to growers in Cape May on December 5, 2014 about the Model Ordinance and its interpretation.

A lengthy conversation occurred about the upcoming decision to list the red knot species on the federal endangered species list. The discussion included potential impacts on the industry, and aquaculture, from regulations that could have arisen due to the red knot population relying on horseshoe crab eggs as a food source.
