

Blue Crab
Callinectes sapidus

Description:

- Olive to blue/green above
- Claws bright blue underneath; females have red tipped claws
- Shell twice as wide as it is long
- 9 marginal teeth; 9th is a long strong spine
- Last pair of legs, called swimmerets, are paddle shaped

Size:


Up to 9 inches from tip to tip of longest spines

Range:

Cape Cod, Massachusetts to Uruguay

Facts:

- Important commercial species
- Breed in salt water
- Migrate to deeper waters in winter
- Females only mate once in their lifetime
- Average lifespan is 3 years
