

Bluefish

Pomatomus saltatrix



Description:

- green/blue back
- silvery white sides
- dark blotch at base of pectoral fins
- large mouth lined with razor sharp teeth
- 2 dorsal fins; 1 spinous fin separated from longer, soft fin

Size:

• up to 45 inches and 27 lbs

Range:

 all oceanic and coastal waters with the exception of the eastern and northwest Pacific


Facts:

- may also live in estuaries and brackish waters
- young live year round in bays and estuaries
- annual migrations lengthen with maturity
- females release between 0.6 -1.4 million eggs in total while migrating along the coasts
- after being fertilized, eggs hatch within 48 hours
- voracious, visual feeders that will attack anything shiny, including jewelry
- known to chase bait fish out of water onto sandy beaches
