

Bowfin

Amica calva



Description:

- Elongated and cylindrical body
- Olive to brown in color
- Long undulating dorsal fin
- Sides can have vertical bars or camouflage pattern
- Blunt head
- Have many sharp teeth
- Juveniles have a black eyespot on the caudal peduncle

Size:

Up to 30 inches

Range:

• Eastern U.S. and as west as the Great Lakes and Mississippi River Basin

Facts:

- Primitive gas bladder allows it to breathe air
- Spawning occurs in the spring, females can lay up to 5,000 eggs
- Males will guard the eggs until they are about 4 inches long
- Prefer lowland rivers, lakes and swamps with slow moving water
