

Quillback

Carpiodes cyprinus



Description:

- deeply compressed body, giving flat appearance from side view
- olive gray above
- ♦ silvery sides
- ♦ long 1st dorsal ray
- upper jaw does not extend beyond front of eye
- white to orange paired fins
- non-paired fins are dusky gray
- ♦ typical sucker mouth

Size:

• up to 26 inches

Range:

 throughout much of eastern North America from Saskatchewan, Canada south to Florida and west to South Dakota, Kansas and Alabama; Great Lakes

Facts:

- prefers pools, backwaters, main channels of creeks, small to large rivers and lakes
- feed and reproduce in schools
- ♦ bottom feeders
- females and males migrate to spawing areas and release eggs and sperm respectively in shallow waters
- eggs remain unguarded on open substrate
- eggs hatch in 8-12 days and are almost immediately independent
